Sen. Morse Tries Again For Vacant Committee Seat

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore.), unsuccessful in several tries for a seat on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, probably is getting ready to make another bid.

Morse won't reveal his plans but the recent primary election defeat of Sen. Brewster of Maine leaves a GOP vacancy on the committee, and Morse is known to want the post.

His last unsuccessful try for it was in the spring of 1951 following the death of Sen. Vandenberg (R-Mich.). The seniority rule — which gives senators with longest service their preference on committee assignments — resulted in Brewster getting the post.

Morse based his 1951 claim on the fact that there is no West Coast representation among Republican committee members. He wrote to Sen. Butler (R-Neb.) that "irrespective of the long established practice of following the rule of seniority, I think the Committee on

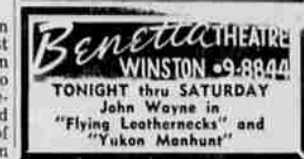

Committees and the Republican Conference should recognize that overweighing any committee with members elected from just the Middle West and East Coast is not sound Republican policy in the handling of committee assignments."
