There were 2,000 turkeys in the opening shipment, bringing 40 cents a pound for A grade hens. That meant a quoted price of 48 cents a pound to retailers, who were expected to market the birds for 58 cents a pound, 5 cents under the price of a year ago.

Apology By U.S. Follows Blasting Of Plants On Yalu
LONDON — Informed sources said U.S. Secretary of State Dean Acheson apologized to about 200 members of the British Parliament Thursday for failure to notify Britain in advance of the American bombing of Yalu River plants in Korea this week.
Acheson spoke for 20 minutes to a group of M.P.'s and Lords representing various parties. It was a private meeting.
Among those attending was left-wing Laborite Aneurin Bevan. The group is a loosely knit one. It is known as the British-American Parliamentary group whose members are particularly interested in British-American relations.
The source said Acheson told them American officials had intended to tell the British defense minister, Field Marshal Lord Alexander, in Washington about the plan to bomb the power plants.
Situation Fouled Out
But, added the source, there was a snafu—(situation normal, all fouled up)—and in the mix-up Alexander was not notified.
Alexander and Selwyn Lloyd, British minister of state for foreign affairs—the No. 2 man to Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden—arrived in Washington last Saturday. The bombings were on Monday.
The source said Acheson said he was sorry that neither had been told about the attack on the power plants.
Apparently, the informant added, there was confusion about who should have told them, indicating that the State Department thought the Defense Department had, and that the Defense Department thought State had.
MacArthur Ouster U.S. Act Alone, Truman Says
WASHINGTON — The White House said Thursday no foreign government was responsible for or even influenced President Truman's decision to oust Gen. Douglas MacArthur from his Far Eastern commands.
Emanuel Shinwell, who was defense minister in the British Labor government, said in the House of Commons Wednesday night that it was pressure from the Labor government which led to MacArthur's recall in 1951.

Heppner Votes Bonds For 1st Sewer System
HEPPNER — The long-discussed sewer disposal system for Heppner can go ahead now. In a special election residents approved a \$300,000 bond issue to finance construction, 282 to 51.
The State Sanitary Authority for three years has urged the city to build the system to eliminate stream pollution. It will be the first sewer system here, including a disposal plant.

Russia Killing Off Prisoners Of War, Charge
PARIS — The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) charged Thursday that war prisoners in Soviet hands are being systematically killed off by forced labor in Russia and Northern Siberia.
In a lengthy analysis of the fate of millions of Europeans and Japanese captured by Soviet armies during the war, NATO declared it is impossible to know exactly how many of the estimated three million still in Soviet hands at the end of 1946 are still alive.
"It is likely," said the NATO report, "that most of the three million 'missing' prisoners have filled common and nameless grave pits along the new trans-Siberian railway."
It said that at the end of 1946 some two million Western axis prisoners—Germans, Italians, Hungarians and some French—and about 800,000 Japanese were working in Central Siberia on the new northern link of the trans-Siberian railway which runs from the middle valley of the Volga to the northern tip of Lake Kaje Baikal.
Said the report:
"In Central Siberia, north of Lake Baikal, the winter temperature goes down to 30, 40, and 50 degrees below zero. Extermination of human beings does not require a specific effort. All that is re-

quired is to underfeed them and to underclothe them. Temperature will take care of the rest."
The report charged that the Russians repatriated only about half the prisoners they captured during the war, a total estimated at about seven million.
The other half, about three and a half million, are dead and "missing."
