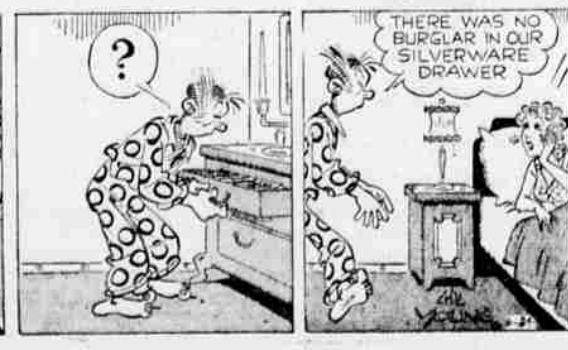

Shakespearean Festival To Show New Top Stars

ASHLAND — New faces in top roles and familiar faces in unfamiliar parts will feature the Oregon Shakespearean festival this season.

Such established festival favorites as Richard Graham, Angus Bowmer, and Bill Ball again have excellent parts in the four-play repertoire, but parts quite different from those which they played last year.

Bowmer, festival producing director whom patrons have seen the past few seasons in such broad comedy roles as Falstaff and Sir Toby Belch, this year plays the sinister Casca in "Julius Caesar" and King of France in "Henry V."

Graham, who attracted much attention in the heavy, tragic role of the aged King Lear last season, this year plays a comedy lead, Benedick, in "Much Ado About Nothing."

Bill Ball, who charmed audiences with his comic Feste in "Twelfth Night" last season, plays Antony in "Julius Caesar" and the sprite, Ariel, in "The Tempest" this season. All play other roles as well.

One of the prime appeals for the festival has for young actors is the variety of appearing in a repertory company, Angus Bowmer, producing director, says, and this is borne out by roles given another pair of festival veterans, Bill Oyler and Philip Hanson.

The latter plays the broadly comic Dogberry in "Much Ado About Nothing" and the treacherous Cassius in "Julius Caesar" on alternate evenings. Oyler plays Pistol, a comic role which he created in "Henry IV, part 2," in 1951, in this year's chronicle play, and does the tragic Brutus in "Caesar."

Another Festival maxim, that no casting is done before auditions in Ashland each year, was also proved this season when a number of actors new to the festival came up with choice roles. Among them are Richard Rizzo, young San Jose State drama student who drew the title role in "Henry V" and Ferdinand in "The Tempest" and Tom Brennen, Cleveland, Ohio, actor who plays Trinculo in "The Tempest" and other top comedy roles.

About 50 per cent of the festival company are new in Ashland this year. Represented are 18 states and one foreign country, Brazil.
