Stassen Urges GOP To Take Dynamic Stand

CHICAGO (U)—Former Gov. Harold E. Stassen of Minnesota said Tuesday he is "gravely concerned" lest the Republican national convention adopt a platform "so conservative" that it would bring defeat to the party in November.

The only candidate for the GOP presidential nomination scheduled to appear before the convention Resolutions Committee, Stassen said his concern developed from a "trend of recent comments" by some party leaders whom he did not name.

The party, he said in a statement prepared for delivery before the committee, must take a "liberal and humanitarian" stand on vital domestic and foreign issues.

The former governor foresaw a platform debate on five issues—foreign policy, civil rights, labor legislation, farm aid and development of the nation's resources.

On foreign policy, he said, Republicans should pledge a "new,

dynamic, affirmative" stand aimed at gradually weakening Communism and winning peace without war.

He said the U. S. should champion dependent peoples and maintain an adequate defense of force with airpower the key.

The presidential hopeful advocated a compulsory federal fair employment practices law, full parity prices for farmers without government controls, a rewritten Taft-Hartley labor law designed to gain "respect of both labor and business," and a broad program of development of natural resources with a maximum of local control.
