Adult Advisors In Demand For Girl's Softball Play

Mayor Al Flegel has girl trouble. He has too many girls and not enough helpers for his newly instituted girls' softball recreation program. He issued a plea today for fellow adult coaches who know the game to turn out to tutor the young girls in the rudiments of softball. "If I don't get help, the program won't succeed," he said.

Expounding on the program, he pointed out that summer recreation for boys was pretty well taken care of with Pee Wee and Junior Legion baseball and swimming courses, but the girls have been overlooked. He hopes to establish the softball program this year and perhaps get money budgeted from the school system and the city for its expansion next year. He intimated that a youth activities program is not complete if it doesn't include both sexes. "As it stands," he said, "there is nothing in re-

creation for girls in Roseburg and the surrounding area."

In further pressing his plea for adult help, he asked for anyone interested to call him immediately. He stated that only an hour every Monday, Wednesday and Friday would aid immensely. The girls practice at Benson School field on these days between 1:30 and 3 p.m.

Reliefers Shine In AL Contests

Baseball's unsung minute men—the relief pitchers—should feel mighty proud of themselves.

Rarely, if ever, have the hurry-up hurlers performed as brilliantly as they did Tuesday throughout the major leagues.

Here is a rundown on the relievers as only two of the 16 starters were the distance.

1. Lou Brissie and Satchel Paige—hooked up in a spectacular pitching duel from the 10th inning on with Brissie and Cleveland finally defeating the St. Louis Browns in a record tying 19-inning game, 4-3.

2. Brissie relieved Bob Feller in the 10th and hurled nine scoreless innings before yielding a tally in the top of the 19th. Paige pitched 10 runless frames after replacing Ned Garver in the ninth.

3. Clem Labine—worked four scoreless innings for Brooklyn after relieving Ralph Branca and was credited with the victory when the Dodgers came from behind to nip the Philadelphia Phillies, 4-3.

4. The Dodgers retain their three and a half game National League lead.

5. Hoyt Wilhelm—stopped a Boston threat in the fifth and went on to yield two runs in the next four innings as the Giants handed the Braves their sixth straight loss, 6-3, to remain on the heels of the Dodgers.

6. Don Johnson—handcuffed the Philadelphia Athletics with two hits and no runs in four innings after Washington had tallied four times in the sixth to preserve the Senators' 6-5 victory. Washington thus moved into second place, three and a half games behind the Yankees.

7. Ted Wilks—relieved Forrest Main with the bases loaded and

now out in the eighth and stopped the Chicago Cubs cold for two innings as Pittsburgh emerged with a 3-2 victory.

8. Fred Hutchinson—Stopped a Chicago three-run uprising in the second inning and pitched seven scoreless frames until he tired in the ninth as Detroit rallied to down the White Sox, 6-4. The defeat dropped the White Sox into fifth place.

In the two games where the starter went the route, Vic Raschi pitched the Yankees to a 3-2 triumph over the Boston Red Sox and Wilmer (Vinegar Bend) Mizell hurled the St. Louis Cardinals to an 8-3 decision over the Cincinnati Reds.
