

Defense Wall Around US Would Provide Mistaken Security, Speaker States

It would be a mistake for the United States to draw a tight defense wall around itself and retire within its security. Under such a condition the people become soft and after a while they would be

unable to fight if the occasion arose. This is the opinion expressed by Henry Warrelmann of Gran's Pass, who fought with the German army during World War II. Warrelmann, who was a division commander at the close of the war and fought in France, Africa and Russia, spoke before the Roseburg Kiwanis Club Tuesday noon in the Hotel Umpqua.

He said: "Young men here should be happy to fight for their country outside, because it would be very bad to have to fight inside."

French Become Soft
The French people, once the finest of soldiers, became soft behind the Maginot line, he recalled.

"Personal freedom can only grow when the freedom of the United States is safe," he said.

Warrelmann has little regard for propaganda. He learned to like the French, once he lived with them. He has learned that people are all the same, if not viewed through the dark glasses of propaganda. He didn't realize what freedom really meant until he came to the United States, and he is now going through the process of becoming naturalized.

He recalled pre-war Germany as a country with 80 million people, who had a very hard time to get enough to eat. He likened Germany to a big drum full of herring, that could only get so full, then had to explode.

Tells African Experience
Warrelmann, born a poor farmer boy, who became self educated after entering the German army at the age of 17, discussed briefly his experiences with Rommel, the Desert Fox, in Africa. He recalled Rommel's statement that it would be harder to stop the Italians from retreating than to stop the British advance. He told of several incidents in this campaign, where consideration of the enemy on either side was shown. On one occasion a temporary truce was called, after the British erroneously killed and wounded many of their own men in a grenade attack. The Germans loaned some of their doctors and Red Cross men to care for the wounded. Similar courtesies were extended by the British.

But the situation was different while fighting in Russia, he said. Going from desert warfare and 150 degree heat to below zero weather, he got an opportunity to look into the so-called "paradise" of workmen.

"I would like to have all communists in America visit this worker's paradise in Russia," he said. "Not one would come back a communist."

It is a country in which people are poor in a rich country. It is a place in which parents don't trust their children. He discussed briefly conditions in Russia under the Communists. He also talked on the strength of Russia. The communists have some very good military leaders, he said. They know very much about Russia, and we know very little about them. We take it too easy with the Russians, he declared.

Russian standards are very much below those of this country, and as such it takes much less for them to subsist. He emphasized that Russia should not be taken lightly.

S., local Glendale physician, the new clinic is the first step in development of a Community Health Center and small hospital as planned for this area by Dr. Ferguson and his staff.

A boy, 7 1/2 pounds, was born to Mr. and Mrs. William Allen, Glendale, June 25. A boy, eight pounds, three ounces, was born to Mr. and Mrs. Arnold Monke, Wolf Creek, June 25. A boy, seven pounds, four ounces, was born to Mr. and Mrs. Calvin McDowell, Glendale, June 30. A boy was also born to Mr. and Mrs. N. W. Moody, Glendale, at the Forest Glen Hospital in Canyonville.

The new medical office and clinic in Glendale take the place of a smaller office building occupied by Dr. Ferguson until the last of May. A larger waiting room, more examination and treatment rooms downstairs, in addition to in-patient rooms upstairs provide more adequate service.

A new and larger X-ray machine has already been ordered and other expansion is planned. The house, built as a doctor's office and residence a number of years ago, has been in the past several years been operated as a boarding home. It is set in commodious, park-like grounds and has long been a show place in the city.
