Al Flegel Gets Nod As Alternate To Demos' Meet

Walter H. Dodd of Eugene, delegate to the Democratic National Convention from the fourth district, today named Al Flegel of Roseburg as his alternate to the convention.

Flegel, mayor of Roseburg, was runner up in the May election as delegate to the Democratic convention.

Dodd, in an issued statement, reaffirmed his support of Estes Kefauver for the Democratic Presidential nomination. He pledged to use his best efforts to secure the nomination for Kefauver, and will support him as long as he has a chance for it.

Dodd commented that anyone who promises to shift the Oregon delegation after the first ballot to Adlai Stevenson, Averell Harriman or any other candidate is talking through his hat.

Dodd, who was recently elected secretary of the Oregon delegation, is leaving for Chicago to attend the conventions. He will be a guest at the Republican convention, which opens Monday, July 7.
