Steady Fred Sanford had San Diego in control all the way Wednesday night as Portland handed the second-place Padres their second straight Pacific Coast League loss. Sanford allowed only three hits in framing a 7-shutout over the Californians.

Sacramento, now out of the league cellar and aspiring for a still higher berth, also made it two-in-a-row with Seattle's Rainiers the victim. Ken Gables pitched a five-hitter to lead Sacramento to a 4-0 win over the Rainiers.

This victory, plus Los Angeles 3-2 win over San Francisco, shoved the Seals deeper into the cellar. The Seals capitalized on Seattle errors to win the game in the fourth inning.

At Portland, the Beavers' Joe Brovia hit safely in his 12th consecutive game, and one of his two blows was his 13th home run of the season in the seven frame with one aboard. San Diego, leading the league for many weeks of the campaign, now is within one game of slipping into third place.

Oakland blanked the Hollywood Stars, 5 to 0, and moved within three games of first place. George Bamberger held the Stars

to four hits. Tookie Gilbert, a former Giant, slammed a homer with one on, and a long fly by Ray Noble scored another run.
