KLAMATH FALLS (AP) — The body of Rancher John Hobbs, 53, who disappeared Saturday, was recovered Tuesday from the Williamson River near his home, 35 miles north of Klamath Falls.

Sheriff Murray Britton said Hobbs apparently had been thrown by his horse, which was found Sunday with indications it had been in the water. The river was dragged to recover the body.

Surviving is a son, Carl Hobbs, who lives at the ranch.

**Whipping Post Revival Urged As Crime On Crime**

LONDON (AP) — The best way to curb crime, says Britain's Lord Chief Justice, is to bring back the old-fashioned whipping post. Gangsters, he said, should be whipped and ridiculed.

The nation's No. 1 jurist, Lord Goddard, told a meeting of London Judges Wednesday night that the four-year-old ban on corporal punishment should be ended.

A flogging with a whip or a birching with a cane cuts deep into British dignity, he said, and would make would-be criminals think twice.
