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Kefauver Scores GOP Platform Plank On Labor

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Kefauver (D., Tenn.), accused the Republican party Thursday of having "made the American worker the forgotten man."

In a prepared statement, the leading candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination said the 1952 GOP platform had "given the waste-basket treatment" to labor proposals of both the American Federation of Labor and the Congress of Industrial Organizations.

"In its eagerness to serve the Wall Street wing," he declared, "the Republican party once again has turned its back on 16 million trade unionists."

The platform was denounced also by the United Textile Workers of America union (AFL), in a joint statement by President Anthony Valente and Secretary Lloyd Kientert.

Apparently anticipating the nomination of General Eisenhower,

they called upon "the Republican presidential candidate" to repudiate "the viciously reactionary, plainly anti-labor Republican platform," adding:

"The working people of the nation want to know from General Eisenhower whether he is supporting the completely unacceptable, flagrantly anti-labor platform submitted by the resolutions committee."

Truman is sitting in on the Republican National Convention by television. He's probably seen more of some major Chicago activities than have the GOP candidates right on the scene.

So far, he says he's happy over what he's witnessed of inter-party wrangling, but is "worried" over indications his favorite candidate — Robert A. Taft — is going to get beat.

Truman has been watching on a large-screen TV set in the White House. Aides said he "tore himself away from television" Wednesday to greet Secretary of State Acheson returning from a tour of Europe and South America.

Truman's trip to the airport apparently caused him to miss the address yesterday by Sen. Joseph McCarthy (R., Wis.), a bitter critic of the administration.

Reporters asked the President whether he had anything to say about "the mistakes of the Acheson-Truman-Lattimore party described in Chicago by Senator McCarthy."

Truman, his good humor vanishing, snapped that he didn't know anything about that. He added:

"But if McCarthy said it, it's a damned lie, you can be sure of that."

Funds Received To Grant Autos To Disabled Vets

Funds to provide automobiles for seriously disabled veterans have been allotted to regional offices of the Veterans Administration under provisions of the Third Supplemental Appropriations Bill, it has been announced by the VA.

The bill, which provides the VA with \$25,000,000 for automobiles and \$2,300,000 for service indemnity claims, was signed recently by the President.

The bill also included funds for subsistence and tuition payments for veterans training under the G.I. Bill; \$60,000,000 for compensation and pension payments, and deaths under the National Service Life Insurance Act.

Because of a lack of funds, the VA has held up payments on approved applications for automobiles or other conveyances for seriously disabled veterans under Public Law 187, 82nd Congress, which amended the original "Cars for Amputees" law.

The VA estimates that some 14,000 veterans of World War II and the Korean campaign will be eligible for \$1,600 grants for the purchase of automobiles.

Authorizations to purchase new cars will be mailed to each veteran whose application has been approved by the VA.

The new automobile law, effective October 20, 1951, did not contain an appropriation, and the \$25,000,000 provided by the supplemental appropriations bill is the first money to be made available under the act.

The law applies to eligible disabled veterans of World War II and those who served in the armed forces on and after June 27, 1950—the day fighting began in Korea.

To be eligible for automobiles and other conveyances, veterans must be entitled to purchase new cars for any of the following service-connected disabilities:

1. Loss or permanent loss of use of one or both feet.
2. Loss or permanent loss of use of one or both hands.
3. Complete loss of sight in both eyes or permanent impairment of vision of both eyes to the degree as to constitute virtual blindness.

ANOTHER BONUS ASKED

Failure To Report Address Change Holds Up Bonus

Many bonus checks are being returned to the bonus division because the payees failed to report their changes of address after applying, the Department of Veterans Affairs reported today.

H. C. Saalfeld, bonus supervisor, said the department has been able to locate and pay some of the applicants.

"In spite of this search," Saalfeld said, "we still have more than 70 bonus payments on hand which were returned by the post office because the payees failed to notify either the postmaster or the bonus division of their changes of address."

All veterans who moved after applying for the bonus were reminded to notify the bonus division, state veterans' department, Salem, of their current whereabouts, giving their old and new addresses. Saalfeld said the department is receiving numerous inquiries from bonus recipients who believe their payments to be too small. Such persons are advised to go ahead and cash their checks, then write the bonus division, giving in detail their own computation of the amount they feel they should have been paid.

They should keep in mind, however, that the bonus act authorizes payment only for each full month of domestic duty and each full month of foreign duty or sea

duty, between the dates of September 16, 1940, and June 30, 1946. Next of kin of men who died in service or following discharge were also reminded of their entitlement to the bonus, if the deceased was an Oregon veteran for one year prior to his service. Survivors entitled, in priority, are the unmarried widow; the child or children; or the parent or parents of the deceased veteran.
