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Savitt Favored As Eight Stay In Clay Court Event

CHICAGO (AP) — Californians composed half the eight-player field in Friday's quarterfinals of the National Clay Courts tennis tourney, but a top-seeded Easterner and a Japanese Davis Cupper were the hottest contenders.

Still the man to beat was Dick Savitt, Orange, N. J., the nation's No. 2 player, first-ranked in this meet, who moved against fifth-seeded Grant Golden of Wilmette, Ill.

But Savitt's play at River Forest Tennis Club this week—only four games dropped in 40 played during three rounds—has been duplicated exactly by Japan's No. 1 Davis Cupper, Jiro Kumamaru.

Savitt and Kumamaru have played almost flawless tennis in their sweep through the first three rounds. Of the Jap's four games lost out of 40, three were recorded Thursday in beating Don Kaiser of Louisville, Ky., 6-1, 6-2.

At one time in Savitt's 6-1, 6-0 walk over Harrison Bows of High-

land Park, Ill., the New Jersey swinger scored 11 straight points. Bill Quillian of Seattle and Don Flye of Tacoma posted a second round 6-2, 7-5 men's doubles victory over William Cranston, San Marino, Calif., and Jack Frost, Monterey, Calif.

In women's doubles Patsy Heard, Portland, Ore., and Sarah Mae Turner, Evansville, Ind., scored an easy 6-1, 6-3 triumph over Patricia Elsenrath, Chicago, and Martha Goebel, Clayton, Mo.

Sen. Cain Warns Against Abuse Of GOP Choice

CONVENTION HALL, CHICAGO (AP) — Sen. Harry P. Cain of Washington told the Republican National Convention Thursday its presidential nominee will face a tough fight in November and the delegates should not abuse him here.

The reference obviously was to the bitter intra-party fighting for the nomination and the harsh words that have been traded by opposing GOP factions.

"We have no assurance now of victory next November," Cain said in an address prepared for Thursday's session.

"All we have reason to believe is that victory will not be easy. Under the most favorable circumstances a victory will be exceedingly difficult to achieve. Under adverse circumstances, which we may create, victory will be impossible."

In a plea for party harmony, Cain said a GOP victory could result if all members of the party "understand what allegiance, loyalty and devotion to the principles of our party really mean."

No Excuse For Abuse — Because a particular candidate's "every view and act does not coincide with mine or yours is not a legitimate excuse to abuse him here or to fail to support him as our nominee," Cain said.

"Each candidate we have is honest, healthy, intelligent, and devoted to the task of keeping America strong and the free world free."

With help from all Republicans, Cain added, the GOP nominee will win, and without that help "he will wallow in the mire of futility."

Cain told the delegates the Republicans "have no monopoly on reliable, good and honest men."

Prices Of Butter, Eggs Go Higher; Meat Irregular

Retail prices of top grade eggs went up sharply in many stores this week. Butter also was higher. Several fresh fruits and vegetables were a little cheaper, reflecting abundant supplies.

Changes in meat prices were scattered and irregular, with reductions largely confined to special mark-downs to attract customers. There was little uniformity in these spots. Most frequently mentioned by leading chains and independent markets were: frying chickens, sirloin and porterhouse steaks, top and bottom round roasts, boneless chuck pot roast, rib roasts, fresh and frozen fish and lobster. Some stores continued to stress such picnic items as frankfurters, boiled ham and cold cuts.

Top grade eggs advanced as much as 12 cents a dozen over last week. Dealers blamed a loss of production and storage difficulties because of hot weather, heavy resort demand and increased buying by the military.

Butter Up One Cent — Butter rose a penny or two a pound in many sections, reflecting a seasonal downturn in production and a bigger diversion of milk to fluid channels. Demands for milk by the ice cream makers was reported exceptionally heavy. Butter storage stocks were below those of a year ago.

Small summertime fruits still topped the produce bargain lists in widespread marketing areas. Seedless grapes, for example, were less than half of last week's price at the wholesale level in some places. Blueberries and raspberries were at the peak of the cherries were plentiful.

Fruit At Lower Prices — Also lower as a rule this week: watermelons, cantaloupes, peaches (though most markets still had only early varieties), grapefruit and apricots. Lemons were a little lower but another spell of exceptionally hot weather over large areas would send their prices soaring again, produce men said.

Summer squash was abundant and low-priced. Snap beans, carrots, celery, cucumbers, lettuce, peas and tomatoes also were lower. Many stores reported slightly higher prices this week on cauliflower, asparagus (which is about through for the season), cabbage, mushrooms, oranges and plums.
