Speeding westward toward New York, the black and white beauty at noon Eastern Atlantic time had covered 903 nautical miles in the 25 hours since noon Friday at 36.08 knots.

This clip compared with an average speed of 35.59 knots in the eastbound crossing last week end, on which she set a record of three days, 10 hours, 40 minutes.

The United States, bearing 1,650 passengers, picked up speed for a possible attempt to smash the westward Atlantic crossing record immediately after clearing the English Channel Friday.

A half-ton, electronically-controlled robot built to the exact scale of a No. 2 fruit or vegetable can, will be in Roseburg Wednesday afternoon to present Mayor Albert G. Flegel with an invitation for people of Roseburg to attend the opening of the American Can Company's new fibre milk container plant in Portland Aug. 7.

The robot, Canco Charlie, has electronic "innards" enabling him to walk, talk, move his head and arms. He travels in a 38-foot trailer.

The local event is scheduled to advertise the completion of the first complete paper milk container manufacturing unit in the Northwest. This plant, which will be opened in Portland Aug. 7, makes the paper containers used by many of Oregon's milk distributors.

Charlie, his sponsors report, will tell the Roseburg audience that Douglas County produces approximately 6,500,000 quarts of whole milk annually, of which a large portion is distributed to customers in fibre containers.

Mishaps Kill 7 In Washington

Accidental death claimed the lives of seven Washington state residents over the weekend. Four drowned and three were killed in traffic accidents.

The victims:
Zenichi J. Kato, 21, of Seattle, who was found dead in his bed Sunday morning, several hours after his car went out of control and struck a power pole and ramed into some parked cars. The accident happened in Seattle.

Martin Jacobsen, 28, Seattle, died Sunday of injuries suffered late Saturday when he lost control of his motorcycle he was riding, skidded 200 feet and struck a utility pole. Jacobsen was thrown 80 feet by the impact.

Omar Buckles, 67, Wapato, who was drowned in an irrigation canal west of Wapato Saturday when he lost control of his automobile while backing it down a hill. The car plunged into the ditch.

John E. Bonderenko, 44, Spokane, drowned Saturday when he fell from a log at Bear Lake, near Chatteroy, Wash. Bonderenko's body was recovered.

Larry Arlen Peters, 14, Tacoma, drowned in a lake near Eatonville Sunday during a family picnic. His body was not recovered. The two other youths, Willis Hunt Jr. and Kenneth Emmil, were rescued.

Gail Farmer, 6, Renton, drowned in Lake Sammamish, near Seattle, Sunday while taking swimming lessons from her mother, Mrs. William Farmer. The child's body was recovered later by sheriff's deputies.
