New Medical Procedure Will Aid Korea Vets

Post-Korea veterans who need outpatient treatment for disabilities that are presumed to have resulted from their service will be provided needed treatment by the Veterans Administration until the VA can determine whether their disabilities actually are service-connected.

According to the VA, the new procedure is designed to prevent any delay in furnishing outpatient treatment for Korean veterans. Under existing regulations, outpatient treatment may be given only for service-connected disabilities after the VA has determined the disabilities are service-connected and has authorized treatment.

Where the VA later finds that disabilities are not service-connected, outpatient treatment will be discontinued from that date. To be eligible for dental outpatient treatment under these conditions, a post-Korea veteran must file his application within 12 months from the date of his discharge or release from a period of 6 months or more of active service that has been terminated on or after June 27, 1950.

Oregonians Are Responsible For Most Accidents, Oregonians, not tourists from other states, pile up most of Oregon's traffic accidents.

23,517 Traffic Violations Are Listed For State, Oregon drivers were convicted of 23,517 moving traffic violations during the first six months of 1952, Secretary of State Earl T. Newby reported Friday.

Leading the list was driving while intoxicated with 1,367 convictions and subsequent suspensions of driver licenses. Suspension of license for drunk driving is mandatory under Oregon law, Newby reported.

Other major traffic offenses for which licenses were suspended following court convictions, or on the basis of action in the Secretary's office, included while licenses were suspended or revoked, 406; reckless driving, 189; failure to report an accident, 110; violation of basic rule, 80; and failure to appear for tests, 27.

Thirty-nine licenses were lifted from drivers who had had driving records, Newby said, these drivers had too many traffic violations and accidents to be considered safe risks behind the wheel.
