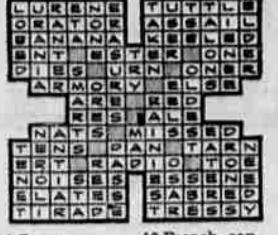

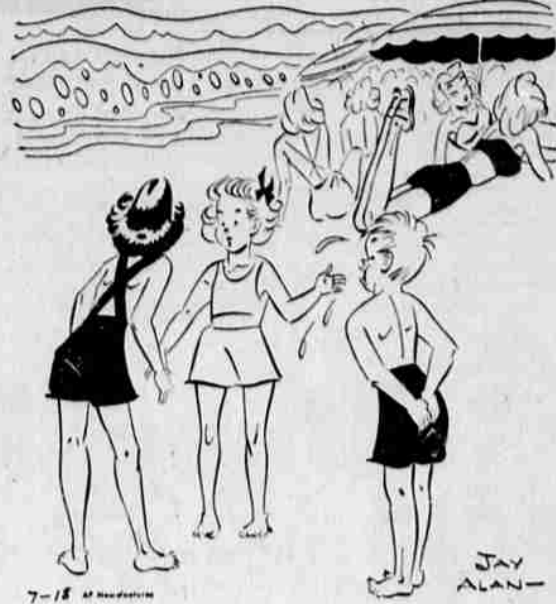

Roseburg School Education Costs Shown In Report

It costs \$366.23 a year to give your son or daughter a Roseburg high school education, and \$309.16 if he or she is in grade school. That's the average expenditure per child from the Roseburg School District No. 4 general fund, according to a report for the 1951-52 school year released at the board of education meeting Monday night. The school district came out in the black last year, financially speaking. Total revenues were \$1,064,000. Expenses were only \$997,447.85. (These are general fund figures, and include everything except bond issues for building purposes.) Per student averages are figured on the basis of the 3,009.5 average daily attendance at the District's six schools—Senior High, Junior High, Rose, Benson, Riverside and Fullerton. High school students, with an average daily attendance of 1063.8 use up the most money per student. Next most expensive is the Junior High, with \$355.38 for 425.9 students. They keep going down: Fullerton, \$325.41, for 387.3 students; Benson, \$324.77, for 293.5 students; Riverside, \$292.88, for 341.4 students. Rose School, with 297.7 attendance, has the lowest per pupil cost—\$286.99. General control funds pay for supervision; teaching staff; plant operation; maintenance and repairs; such auxiliary agencies as the nurse; lunch co-ordinator and transportation; fixed charges like insurance and retirement pay; and capital outlay for furniture and equipment, library books and new sites.

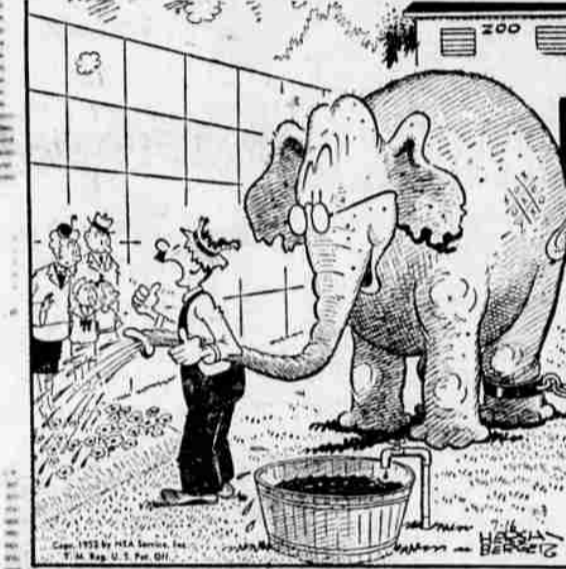
