

Wage Boost Offered Oregon Phone Workers

PORTLAND (AP)—Some 4800 Pacific Telephone and Telegraph workers in Oregon have been offered wage increases ranging from \$2.50 to \$4.50 weekly, the company said Tuesday.

The union asked pay boosts from \$4.50 to \$22.50 and 178 contract

changes, the company reported. Negotiations with the CIO Communications Workers, representing the employees, have been underway since June 9. The contract expires Aug. 1.

U.N. Planes Strike Near North Korean Capital

SEOUL, Korea (AP)—United Nations warplanes Tuesday battered Communist targets near the North Korean capital of Pyongyang and along the Western Front.

Planes from two fighter-bomber wings hit a locomotive repair shop and cement factory east of Pyongyang. Direct hits were reported on both targets, causing one secondary explosion. Pilots said they also smashed two buildings.

U. S. War Casualties In Korea Near 113,000

WASHINGTON (AP)—Announced U.S. battle casualties in Korea reached 112,843 Wednesday, an increase of 715 since last week.

The Defense Department's weekly summary based on notifications to families through last Friday reported these new totals:

Killed in action 17,783; wounded 82,493; missing 12,567; battle deaths 19,838; current missing 9,520.

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MISSING—Albert C. Federal authorities have entered the search for Reed.

Steel For Civilian Use Freed To Industry

WASHINGTON (AP)—In a move aimed at checking the spread of industrial idleness, the government freed for civilian use Monday all steel not needed by the military. Production Chief Henry H. Fowler said the action clears the way for small and medium-sized manufacturers to keep producing such goods as washing machines, vacuum cleaners, metal furniture and household appliances.

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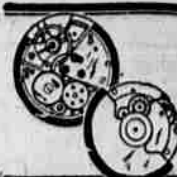

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Resignation Of Tax Collector Accepted

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Bureau of Internal Revenue has "requested and accepted" the resignation of Ernest E. Killen as collector of internal revenue for Delaware. John B. Dunlap, commissioner of internal revenue, said Friday night the action "was not related to the official conduct" of Killen's office. This was not explained. Killen is the ninth collector to leave office in the past year. The other eight resigned or were fired in connection with tax investigation.

PORTLAND BANANA CAKE

This moist, rich, loaf cake is a good traveler. Leave it in the pan, cut and serve right at the picnic. It's another of the special recipes developed by Martha Meade for folks who live in this vicinity. Use Drifted Snow Flour, follow the recipe... and you can't miss!

Sift flour before measuring. Use level measurements for all ingredients. Have all ingredients at room temperature (about 70°). Preheat oven to baking temperature, 350°, a moderate oven. Grease and flour an oblong pan, 13x9x2 inches. Sift together into a mixing bowl—

2 cups sifted Sperry Drifted Snow "Home-Perfected" Enriched Flour
1½ teaspoons double-action baking powder
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon salt
1½ cups sugar

Add—
½ cup high grade vegetable shortening
1 cup mashed banana pulp (3 medium-size, ripe bananas)
¼ cup milk
1 teaspoon vanilla

Beat 2 minutes by electric mixer on medium speed, or beat vigorously with a spoon, about 150 strokes per minute. Scrape sides and bottom of bowl frequently. Then add—
½-¾ cup whole egg, unbeaten (2 large)
Beat 2 minutes more, scraping bowl frequently. (Although the total mixing time is 4 minutes, when beating by hand you may rest as often as necessary; but be sure total beating time remains 4 minutes.) Stir in by hand—
½ cup finely chopped nuts

Pour batter into prepared pan and bake in preheated oven 35 minutes, or just until cake is done. Remove from oven and let loaf cool in pan. When loaf is thoroughly cold it may be served plain or iced with Lemon Butter Frosting. 12 servings.

Lemon Butter Frosting

Measure into a mixing bowl—
¼ cup soft butter
2 tablespoons cream
1 tablespoon strained lemon juice
3 cups sifted powdered sugar

Beat vigorously with a spoon, or on the electric mixer at medium speed, until icing is smooth and creamy.

Martha Meade says: "Save those small scraps of leftover pastry! Baked crisp and golden brown, they're grand for croissants in soup or added (at the very last minute) to a tossed green salad. Roll out your leftover pastry and sprinkle it with grated cheese or caraway or celery seed. Cut into tiny squares and bake until nicely browned. Men like this 'professional' touch."

Martha Meade says: "When greasing cookie sheets, grease only small spots in rows over the pan just where the cookies will be placed. This will save you a lot of hard scrubbing off browned grease from the pan and will also help gauge the size and number of cookies on the pan."

WILLAMETTE STRAWBERRY PIE

Prettiest pie you ever made. High and fluffy as a pink cloud. This recipe has been okayed by Martha Meade for use anywhere in this community. Just remember: the recipe calls for Sperry Drifted Snow Flour. Success depends upon it!

Sift flour before measuring. Use level measurements for all ingredients. Measure into the top part of a double boiler—
½ pound marshmallows (32)
¼ cups sliced fresh strawberries*

Heat over boiling water until marshmallows melt. Stir frequently to blend ingredients. When marshmallows are melted remove from heat and chill* until mixture is very thick. Then fold in—
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 tablespoon strained lemon juice
few grains salt
1 cup whipping cream, beaten until stiff

Turn into—
a baked and cooled deep 9-inch pie shell
Chill in refrigerator until completely firm, 3-4 hours, or until ready to serve. Garnish with sliced strawberries around the edge. 6 servings.

*Frozen berries may be used. Use 1 package (12 oz.). **If pan is set in cracked ice or ice water it will hasten the chilling, taking about ¾ to 1 hour.

Pastry

Stir together in a mixing bowl—
1½ cups sifted Sperry Drifted Snow "Home-Perfected" Enriched Flour
1 teaspoon salt

Measure in same cup and add all at once—
¾ cup Wesson Oil (¾ cup plus 2 tablespoons)
3 tablespoons cold milk

Stir with fork until pastry clings together. Press into a ball, flatten slightly and place between 2 sheets of waxed paper (12-inch squares). Roll out gently until pastry circle reaches edges of paper. Peel off top paper, then pick up pastry and bottom paper by one edge (they will cling together). Place, paper-side up, over a 9-inch pie pan. Then loosen pastry at edges and carefully peel off paper. Ease pastry snugly into place. Build up a fluted edge and prick bottom and side thoroughly with table fork. Bake for 8-10 minutes on lower rack in a preheated very hot oven, 475°, or until golden brown.
