**Chiang Says Russia Would Aid China Reds In Mainland Attack**

TAIPEH, Formosa (AP) — President Chiang Kai-Shek says Russia would help defend the Communist Chinese mainland against an attack by his Nationalist forces. He said he does not think a United Nations, American, British or French blockade of the China Coast, or other such positive steps would provoke another world war. "In my view," Chiang declared, "all actions of the Kremlin will be based on the calculation that they will strengthen the position of Soviet Russia. . . . The Kremlin will not deviate from this policy in the interest of its satellites. As it is clear that the outbreak of another world war at the present time will be disadvantageous. . . . she will not come out in open conflict with the west. . . ."

**Douglas Fir Shipments Record First Half Of '52**

PORTLAND (AP) — The West Coast Lumbermen's Association reported Monday that Douglas fir lumber shipments exceeded five billion board feet the first half of this year. The total of 5,092,065,000 board feet was below the first half of 1951, but Harris E. Smith, association secretary, said it was believed to be above any other similar period. Production for the first half of 1952 totaled 5,085,371,000 board feet and orders 5,016,401,000.
