After Shocks Continue To Shake California

TEHACHAPI, Calif. — After-shocks from Monday's big earthquake continue to shake Southern California with the latest causing some damage but no casualties.

A series of three shocks Friday one of them equal in intensity to the 1933 Long Beach disaster, caused two landslides in the Caliente Creek area 35 miles east of Bakersfield.

One slide badly damaged a pickup truck in which three men were riding, but they escaped injury. Two houses in the area were damaged. Sheriff's deputies evacuated four persons from their homes.

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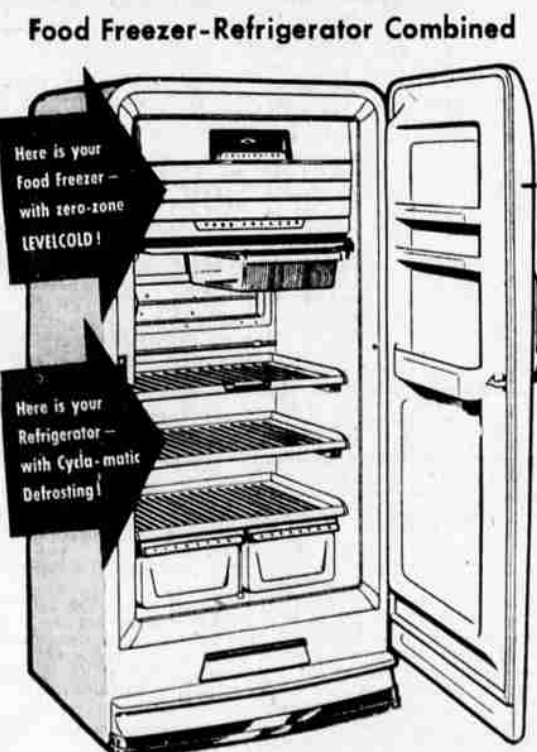
