REDS ENCOURAGE TATTLING VIENNA (AP) — Communist Hungary looks upon children who run with tales to teacher as the best type of pupil. This came to light in a report of a teachers' conference held in Budapest recently in the presence of Hungary's Communist boss, Premier Matyas Rakosi. The progress made in encouraging tale-bearing was a main theme of the conference. The slogan: "One child must control another" was adopted. The Communist teachers applauded enthusiastically when one of their number addressed the conference and said: "Who would have thought, who would have dreamed, that the pupils themselves today control the truancy of their comrades. The best and model students elect control commissions who watch the lazy students and the truants, who reprimand them and report them to the teachers, if their behavior does not improve. "How much nicer this is than in the past, when the pupils protected themselves behind the backs of the teachers."

COLLEGE GRADS EARN MORE NEW YORK (AP) — College graduates earn more than people with less schooling, says the Alfred P. Sloan research organization. Its figures show the average college graduate earns \$45,000 more from graduation to age 65 than does the high school graduate who fails to continue school work. And the college graduate makes \$79,000 more than the grade school graduate. The figures also show that 26 per cent of grade school graduates earn more than \$4,000 a year. For high school people the figure is 46 per cent and 71 per cent for college graduates.

METERS GET RARE COINS EDMONTON, Canada (AP) Parking meters here are serving as foreign exchange banks. Coins from every corner of the world are represented in the daily collections. There are pieces from the United States, Holland, Arabia, Palestine, Belgium, France, Japan, Mexico, South America, Ireland, Hong Kong, Jamaica and India. Prize features of the collection are two gold coins. One is an 1863 minting of a \$2.50 American gold piece; the other an English sovereign of 1907 vintage. The American gold coin, used in a meter as a penny, was quoted at a collector's price of \$25 in 1930.

FARMER HAS TROUBLES YORK, Neb. (AP) — It was one trouble after another on the Lloyd Morgan farm. First the crops were damaged by hail. Then mink began raiding the Morgan henhouse, killing more than 120 baby chicks and two plump hens. So the Morgans set a trap for the mink. They caught the family cat.

COWS' BODY HEAT MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Farm researchers of a regulator company (Minneapolis - Honeywell) report that cows throw off so much body heat that the resultant condensation is a factor in the deterioration of farm buildings. Twenty cows generate enough heat to warm a five-room house on a winter day, they say. Experts are now trying to develop more scientifically controlled barn temperatures.
