NAPLES, Italy (AP) — Exiled King Farouk 1 of Egypt, down to his last yacht, pulled into Naples Tuesday to stay for a few days on the romantic Isle of Capri while he thinks about taking off for the United States.
The Egyptian navy crew manning the \$4,000,000 Mahroussa, which brought Farouk here, is under orders to bring the luxurious ship back to Egypt.

O'Dwyer Denies Plan To Become Mexican Citizen

MEXICO CITY (AP) — Ambassador William O'Dwyer furiously denied reports Tuesday he was considering becoming a Mexican citizen.
The ambassador's violent reaction was provoked by a news story (not by the Associated Press) which speculated on the possibility of O'Dwyer retiring from public life after the November elections in the U. S. and becoming a citizen of Mexico.
O'Dwyer, former New York City mayor, has been very popular in this country.
O'Dwyer, learned by telephone Tuesday morning of publication of the story and immediately summoned U. S. correspondents to the embassy residence.
One of the correspondents present was Robert Prescott, United Press bureau chief, author of the story.
Rage Displayed
O'Dwyer greeted the newsmen in a towering rage and addressed himself to Prescott in language more sulphurous than ambassadorial.
The correspondent, he said phoned him Monday night to inquire about a rumor that he planned to take up legal practice in Mexico.
Pounding a table so that coffee leaped in its cups, O'Dwyer said he replied to the query that it was impossible for him to practice law in Mexico, first, because he was not a Mexican citizen and, second, because he did not have a degree from a Mexican law school.
Midway through the news conference, he ordered Prescott to leave the embassy.
Prescott left after stating that he had his original notes on the telephone conversation to bear out his story.
"I don't care what your notes say," O'Dwyer retorted. "I have three witnesses who were with me at the time who will testify that the statement as regards my citizenship is a lie."
The ambassador said he would submit his resignation as a normal procedure when the new administration comes into office.


New Argument Of Utah Gateway Dispute Ordered

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Interstate Commerce Commission ordered complete reargument Tuesday of the long-pending Ogden (Utah) gateway freight rate case.
Involved in the protracted fight between the Union Pacific railroad and the Denver and Rio Grande Western railroad over division of the vast volume of freight moving to and from the rich Pacific Northwest by way of Ogden.
The two rail systems meet at Ogden and when freight is interchanged between them, a combination of their separate rate structures applies.
The D. and R. G. three years ago filed a formal complaint before ICC that this constituted a discrimination against it and against shippers in the Rocky Mountain area.
D. and R. G. demanded that Union Pacific be forced to set up a system of joint rates with D. and R. G. which would be on a lower basis than the present combination of separate rates.
An ICC examiner has recommended that the joint rate system be approved.
Union Pacific contends that the case involves an attempt by D. and R. G. to "invade" U. P.'s fruitful Northwest territory.
UP Millions At Stake
It estimated Union Pacific would lose about fifty million dollars a year in revenues if D. and R. G. were placed in a position to get a larger share of the Ogden freight business.
After lengthy hearings, the case was finally argued before the ICC last October. A final hearing has been expected since early this year.
However, the commission ordered reargument because of the recent addition of two new members—Martin K. Elliott, of Indiana and Anthony F. Arpaia, of Connecticut—to succeed retiring commissioners on the 11-man ICC.
The action will qualify the new commissioners to take part in the decision.
To date for re-argument was set immediately.


Erring, Irate Wife Puts Thief Brand On Hubby
