

Flogging Cases Bring Penalties To 63 Klansmen

WHITEVILLE, N. C. (AP) — The Ku Klux Klan's puddy imperial wizard, Thomas L. Hamilton, was sentenced to four years in prison Wednesday for masterminding a flogging.

Superior Court Judge Clawson Williams ordered the maximum term for the Klan leader who once boasted he would spread his hooded, anti-Negro, anti-Catholic and anti-Jewish secret society across the nation.

Sentence was passed against Hamilton, a Leesville, S. C. ex-grocer, and 62 other klansmen as the climax of one of the largest mass trials in North Carolina history.

It followed a wave of floggings by night-riders who spread terror through the coastal Carolinas last year.

Fast Work Revives Pool Accident Victims

PENDLETON (AP) — Tuesday for the second straight day a swimmer in the municipal pool lay unconscious on the bottom, but in both cases fast rescue work saved them.

Monday, Wilma Leinweber, 10, hit her head on the bottom in a dive. She was pulled out quickly and revived by artificial respiration.

Tuesday Robert Rackham Jr., 8, visiting here from Wichita, Kan., was hit by a diver and knocked unconscious. The guard pulled him out.

Both remained in the hospital Wednesday where they were reported in satisfactory condition.

Hamilton took the sentence calmly as the judge told him, "I'm very sorry you instigated this thing." Judge Williams told him he hoped he would "get this thing behind you and make your life worth while."

Tinplate Speed Ordered To Save Canning Crops

WASHINGTON (AP) — The National Production Authority Tuesday placed tinplate mills and can manufacturers under strict orders to speed their output to the rescue of the fruit and vegetable crops.

The agency also disclosed that, shortly before the steel strike ended, it had studied the possibility of an Air Force airlift to get tinplate to the Pacific Coast.

The airlift was abandoned in favor of special fast freight trains, which have been moving to West Coast canning centers since Sunday, and rapid highway shipment arranged by the Defense Transport Administration.

NPA telegraphed these instructions to 33 can companies, 27 producers of lids and closures, and the newly opened tinplate mills:

1. They must certify, in ordering tinplate from reopened mills, that the cans made from the metal will be used only to pack perishable foods.
2. Tinplate mills must offer tinplate, of types not ordinarily used for food canning but suitable for

that purpose, to canmakers who certify they can meet packers' requirements for crops being harvested immediately.

3. Tinplate producers must ship at once all finished tinplate which has been lying in their plants by the strike.

NPA reported that "a considerable amount" of the year's crops will be saved by the timely strike settlement and the efforts of the American Association of Railroads, can producers and steel companies.

Can manufacturers estimated that plate lying in the mills, finished but immobilized by the picket lines, will save at least 350 million cans of food.

1952 Lamb Crop Shows Increase

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Agriculture Department reported Wednesday that the 1952 lamb crop was 2 per cent larger than in 1951.

Nevertheless, the 1952 lamb crop is 37 per cent below the 10-year average and only 3 per cent above the 1950 low.

This year's lamb crop totaled 18,401,000 head compared with 17,989,000 last year.

In the 13 western sheep states (11 western states plus South Dakota and Texas) this year's lamb crop is about 2 per cent smaller than in 1951, but in other states it is about 10 per cent above last year.
