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**Baby Dies After
Traffic Mishap**

The Capitol Ambulance was called for an emergency run about 2:30 a.m. Monday when a car carrying the infant son of Mr. and Mrs. Calvin Overcash of Glendale to a Grants Pass Hospital left the road and plunged into an irrigation ditch.

The eight-month-old baby, Bruce, died in the hospital about 1 p.m. the same day.

His parents had planned to take him to the hospital Monday for treatment. His condition became serious during the night, so they started to the hospital in the family car, accompanied by a neighbor.

At the corner where the Glendale Road leaves the old highway, the accident occurred.

Artificial respiration was administered to the child by Ralph Haggard, deputy sheriff who lives nearby. Placed under an oxygen tent immediately at the hospital, the baby failed to rally.

Funeral services will be held today at 2 p.m. in Grants Pass. The corner where the Overcash's car left the road is sharp and unmarked. It has been the scene of several similar accidents.

Since the boiling point of oxygen is higher than that of nitrogen, the two gases in the air may be separated by liquefying air and boiling off the nitrogen.
