No Longer Rich Man, Assertion Of Exiled Farouk

ISLE OF CAPRI — Egypt's ex-King Farouk declared Thursday "I am no longer a rich man."
He denied he had sneaked out a fortune when he was ousted from Egypt and declared he had none tucked away in foreign banks.
Nevertheless, he added: "By the standards of the very poor, I am still to be envied."
Addressing more than 100 newsmen and photographers in the first public statement since he was toppled from his ancient Nile throne in a Military revolt last Saturday, Farouk said he had made no plans about where to live out his life.
"Anyone who says I am going to the United States, England, Switzerland or Southern France, knows more than I do," he declared.
For the time being, he told reporters, he intends to stay on this romantic isle off Southern Italy. **Jabs At New Rulers**
The playboy ex-monarch, now 32, got in a dig at Gen. Mohamed Naguib and others who engineered his ouster. He said he wished the men who threw him out "good luck, because they'll need it."
"I hope they will not think government of a country these difficult days of war crisis is such an easy matter as might perhaps have been thought by those who are new to it," he said.
Farouk, who arrived here Tuesday, asked that he, his wife, ex-Queen Nourmahad and their six-month-old son, Egypt's newly-proclaimed King Ahmed Fuad II, be allowed to live here in peace.
Three daughters by a former marriage are also here with him.
"Other men have lost their jobs," he said. "Other men have known what it is like to have their native land forbidden to them. They'll know how I feel."
"My wife and myself are not embittered about what has happened, for we know we are still rich in the many friends we have."

Six Persons Hurt When Theater Ceiling Falls

AUSTIN, Tex. — Six persons were injured, none seriously, when a part of the ceiling of the downtown Queen theater fell during the showing of a thriller picture at noon Thursday.
Most of the audience, estimated at about 100, were children. Five of the six injured were children, attendants at Brackenridge hospital said.
Scratches and bruises were the chief injuries.

First 'Copters Cross Atlantic

PRESTWICK, Scotland — Two U.S. Army Sikorsky's, the first helicopters to fly the Atlantic, arrived here Thursday after 3,300 mile "hop-along" flight from Westover, Mass.
The two flying windmills had taken off from Keflavik, Iceland, on the last and longest hop of their Atlantic flight.
The experimental flight was launched by the Military Transport Service to test the feasibility of delivering helicopters to Europe by air.
The planes started from Westover Air Force Base two weeks ago on a six-stop, 4,000 mile flight to Wiesbaden, Germany.
The big ships came hovering down here to make aviation history and break the official helicopter distance record by more than 200 miles.
On Saturday the two ships will push on to Amsterdam and then go to Wiesbaden where they will be stationed with an air-sea rescue squadron.

Searchers With Dog Fail To Find Dunkin, Slayer

MEDFORD — A three-day search by five state policemen and a trained dog failed to turn up any trace of George Baker Dunkin, 76-year-old prospector wanted in the shooting of State Policeman Phil Lowd.
Capt. Paul Parson, head of state police in southwestern Oregon, said Wednesday the five combed a large area of northern Jackson County. With them was a dog trained for K-9 service with the Army.
Parson said, however, he believes Dunkin still is in the 100-mile square area, but the rugged, timbered terrain makes search difficult. Dunkin has the advantage of knowing the region intimately, since he has spent his whole life there.

Bond Issue, Special Tax Up To Portland Voters

PORTLAND — The Portland City Council Wednesday voted to put two financial measures on the city's November election ballot.
One calls for a 2 1/2 million dollar bond issue to finance completion of Portland's sewerage disposal system. The money is to be repaid from the sewer use fund.
The other is a special tax to raise \$600,000 for civil defense and disaster relief.
