

Park Board Catches Limit In Trial Of Own Fishery

Members of the Douglas County Parks Board Thursday tested their own Salmon Harbor fishery—and found it good.

As guests of O. H. Hinsdale, Port of Umpqua executive, aboard the Hinsdale cabin cruiser, the "Judy," the park board members trolled for two hours outside the harbor and all came in with the limit of husky silvers.

Included in the party were John Amacher of Winchester, chairman; James Stoop of Roseburg; Mr. and Mrs. Hiram Hash of Canyonville; Frank Taylor of Reedsport; Charles Collins, County Park supervisor, Hinsdale, and Vic Peek, skipper.

Mrs. Hash, besides her two silvers, brought in a large ling cod. The trolling cruise followed Wednesday evening's meeting of the board where progress of the Winchester Bay development and Salmon Harbor administration

were reviewed.

The fishing success of the park officials was typical of trollers' experience generally during the mid week fishing here. After several days of muggy water and a rough bar, which limited skiff and small craft trolling, conditions permitted general enjoyment by patrons of the harbor.

Game Commission representatives here, Ralph Grenfell and Robert Phillips, report that the salmon catches are predominantly silvers, with few chinooks showing at present. However, a large number of chinooks—constituting a run—are reported off shore in the vicinity of Coos Bay.

The Salmon Harbor project, part of the Winchester Bay Tidelands Park and Boat basin, a 75-acre Douglas County Park, is one of 12 publicly dedicated park sites owned and maintained by the County, under the direction of the Parks Board. Salmon Harbor is jointly sponsored by the County and the Port of Umpqua, with O. H. Hinsdale, Charles Collins, and Gard Safley, project manager, as the administrative committee in charge.

Patronage fees for launching, mooring, car and trailer parking and similar services are revenue upon which the liquidation of the project costs are predicated.

Construction of the breakwater, a significant phase of present development activity is well under way, with over 700 feet of the more than 3,000 foot breakwater now partially dredged.

War In Korea Takes Red Peril Off Asia—Joy

ANAPOLIS, Md. (AP)—United Nations fighting in Korea has taken Communist pressure "off all of Asia," Vice-Adm. C. Turner Joy said Monday.

Joy saluted into Annapolis as superintendent of the Naval Academy, asserted the Communist "don't have the capacity to stage any other offensive."

Pressure has been relieved in Indo-China, "possibly Hongkong and possibly Formosa," he said.

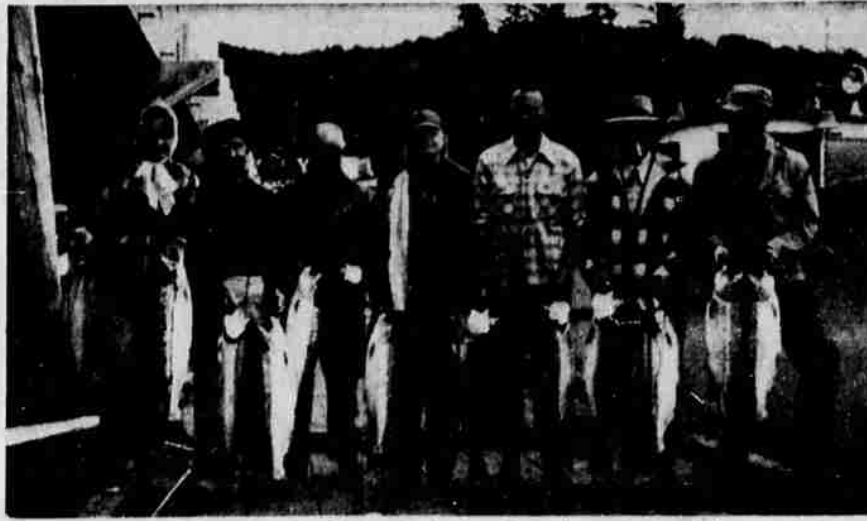
Just back from three years as Naval Chief of the Far East and almost a year as chief United Nations delegate in dragging peace negotiations at Panmunjom, Joy moved in as 37th superintendent of the academy.

He replaced Vice-Adm. Harry W. Hill, who retires this month. Joy told newsmen that he considered the Korean conflict "one of the most important wars we have fought in our history."

We have accomplished a great deal by containing Communism on the continent, even though we have not been able to agree on armistice terms," he said.

By responding to Communist aggression in Korea, "we have told them they can go so far and no further," he said. "We have awakened us to the dangers of Communism."

UN troops are firmly entrenched on the Korean peninsula, he said. They "definitely cannot" be pushed off. And should the Communists launch an offensive as they did in the spring of 1951, "I am sure we would pin their ears back like we did then—we are stronger now than we were then."

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Tunnel Being Built Under Cuba River

HAVANA, Cuba (AP)—The Cuban government is building a \$5,500,000 tunnel under the Almendares River here to eliminate a major bottleneck in Havana's increasingly complex motor vehicle traffic. The tunnel, more than half completed, is to be 708 feet long, and should be ready late this year. Its purpose is to relieve traffic jams at two drawbridges linking Havana with beach resorts, and the exclusive residential sections of Miramar, Jaimanitas and Country Club.

The draw bridges frequently are closed to traffic to allow passage for busy boat traffic on the river. The tunnel is to have four lanes, two in either direction.
