British Food Expert, Wife, Daughter Slain

LURS, France, (AP) — Police said Sir Jack Drummond, British food expert, his wife and 11-year-old daughter were murdered early Tuesday.

The three were on a camping expedition in Southern France.

Police said Sir Jack and his wife were fatally shot, apparently by bandits, and the daughter, Elizabeth, was clubbed to death.

Sir Jack, knighted in 1944, was scientific adviser to the Ministry of Food during World War II and worked out a balanced diet of available foods with the highest nutritive value.

He developed "off white" bread and a liquid food which rallied starvation cases.

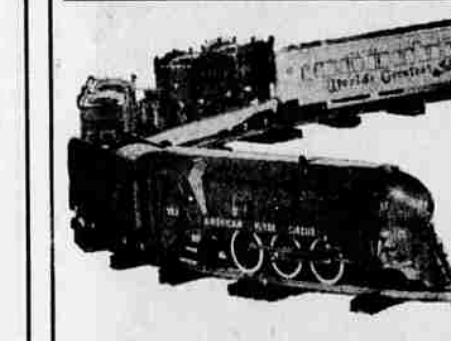
