To Air Service West Coast Adds Empire System

Acquisition of Empire Air Lines by West Coast Airlines took place August 1, with the two systems to be operated henceforth as a single company, H. A. Munter, executive vice president of WCA, announced from Lewiston, Idaho. West Coast will immediately make a showing to the Civil Aeronautics Board that labor protective conditions stipulated have been complied with, and the certificates of both lines will then be reissued as a single certificate to West Coast.

New connecting routes granted with the board approval of the merger were (1) Seattle, Ellensburg, Yakima, Pasco-Kennewick-Richland and Walla Walla and (2) Portland, Yakima, Wenatchee, Ephrata-Moses Lake, Spokane and Coeur d'Alene. Including the approximately 500 miles of new routes, the company will operate more than 2,000 miles connecting 43 cities. West Coast's present route extends from Seattle and Port Angeles on the north along Western Washington and Oregon south to Medford. Empire operates from Spokane and Coeur d'Alene throughout Idaho and in the Inland Empire area of Eastern Washington and Oregon.

Including five planes acquired from Empire with the merger, the new company will operate a fleet of eleven Douglas DC-3's, and employ an estimated 300 persons, with headquarters in Seattle. Munter said survey flights over the two connecting segments will begin within the next two weeks, and first scheduled flights to five cities which have not had local air service before (Yakima, Wenatchee, Ellensburg and Ephrata-Moses Lake) will begin in "early September."

CHIANG HALTS RED MONEY
TAIPEH, Formosa (AP)—Chiang Kai-Shek has ended a steady flow of money from Nationalist China to Communist China. Government sources estimated Chinese on Formosa had been sending about \$200,000 a month via Hong Kong to relatives in Red China.

NEGRO GAMBLING BOSS OF CHICAGO SLAYING VICTIM

CHICAGO (AP)—Theodore Roe, last of the Negro gambling bosses to resist syndicate control over Chicago's lucrative policy wheel racket, was slain Monday night by a blast of shotgun slugs. Roe, 53, a reputed millionaire, walked into an ambush as he left his South Side apartment. A shotgun roared as Roe walked toward his automobile. He fell with wounds in his chest and neck. Police said he never had a chance to reach for a loaded revolver found in his pocket.

Authorities considered several possible motives for the slaying. One, was that he was slain to prevent him from testifying before a federal grand jury which Monday began an investigation of incomes of seven racketeers operating at least two big policy wheels on Chicago's South Side. Vengeance Also Probable

Another possible motive considered was vengeance for the slaying of Leonard (Fat Lenny) Calvano, 42, a Chicago hoodlum who was killed June 18, 1951, when he and three other men allegedly attempted to kidnap Roe. A murder charge against the Negro gambler was dropped when he contended he shot in self defense after Calvano and his companions curbed Roe's automobile and attempted to abduct him. Calvano's brother, Marshall, 39, was ordered picked up for questioning about the Roe slaying.
