## Padres Thump Seals, 4-1; Stars Bow 3-2 To Angels

It's still an open race for the Pacific Coast League pennant and the way the leaders are playing right now, six teams figure in the reckoning.

San Diego, soundly thrashed in seven of eight games with Hollywood, is back in its winning stride and only a game and one-half out of first place. The Padres whipped San Francisco Tuesday night, 4 to 1.

Hollywood, deep in the worst slump it has experienced in a long time, dropped its eighth game in nine starts, bowing for the second in a row to Los Angeles, 3 to 2.

Portland, continuing its surge toward the top, clipped the league-leading Oakland A's, 1 to 0, as Red Adams scattered seven hits.

Seattle, glad to be out of its losing series against Portland, got back into winning stride by dumping the cellar-dwelling Sacramento Solons, 7 to 3.

Seattle overpowered Sacramento, collecting 11 hits off Glenn Elliott and Ambrose Palica, as first sacker Bill Boyd led the attack with three safeties, one a triple.

Roger Bowman and Milo Candini of Oakland allowed Portland batters only five hits. The game's one run was scored in the fourth inning.

Eddie Barr singled and was moved to second on a sacrifice. He stole third on a wild pitch and crossed the plate on Johnny Bero's error.

### Russians Claim Tie In Olympics

MOSCOW (AP) — Nikolai Romanov, head of the Soviet Olympic team at Helsinki and chief of the sports committee in the USSR said Wednesday that the Soviet Union and the United States had finished the Olympic Games in a tie, 94 points to 94.

Ramonov made his statement in an interview with Pravda, the official organ of the Communist Party, on his return to Moscow.

(The point system which Romanov apparently used to arrive at his total gives seven points for first place with 5-4-3-2-1 for the next five points. The Soviet press used this system in contrast to the American system which gives ten points for first place and the same 5-4-3-2-1 for the next five places. Under the American system the United States won, 614 to Russia's 553 1/2.)

On Monday Pravda had headlined that the Soviet Union had won the Olympics with the largest number of points.

## 15-Inning Thriller Won, 7-6, By N.Y.

Even Bobby Shantz' 20th win for the Philadelphia A's takes a back seat Wednesday to the "morning after" gossip about the 15-inning thriller between the Dodgers and Giants.

Little Bobby picked a tough night to cop his 20th. It seemed everybody was gunning for a headline.

Rogers Hornsby was making his bow as Cincinnati manager with a 4-0 win over Chicago. The New York Yankees were meeting their old mate, Spec Shea, for the first time since he was traded to Washington and nipped him 3-2 in a game halted by rain after seven innings.

And then the Giants and Dodgers, favorite sparring partners for years, had to hook up in a five-hour struggle that lasted well into the wee small hours. Don Mueller finally broke it up with an infield chopper that scored rookie Jim Rhodes all the way from second base for a 7-6 win.

Mueller's infield hit scoring while pitcher Chris Van Cuyk threw late to first base, slashed the Dodgers' lead to 5 1/2 games in the opener of a "big" series. Incidentally, it was Mueller's first hit in his last 17 at bat.

Getting back to Shantz, the wee lefty became the earliest 20-game winner in the majors since 1946. That was the year Hal Newhouser made the grade July 27 and Bobby Feller, enroute to a new-strikeout record, hit No. 20 on July 31.

Cleveland dropped four full games behind the Yanks, splitting a twilight-night doubleheader with Chicago. Bob Lemon allowed only four hits in winning the opener, 6-0, his 13th victory.

### L.A. Rams, Chicago Cards Train For Portland Game

PORTLAND — Pre-season practice has begun for the Los Angeles Rams and Chicago Cardinals, the National Football League teams which will clash here at Multnomah Stadium Saturday night, August 30, in a game promoted by Oregon Sports Attractions.

The Rams, priming to defend their world's professional football championship are training at Redlands, Cal. The Cardinals, seeking to regain their past gridiron glory under a new coach, Joe Kuharich, are practicing at Lake Forest, Ill.

Each team will have had two pre-season games under its belt before arriving in Portland, so will be in peak condition and well coordinated for the August 30 encounter.

Two weeks prior to their jaunt to the Northwest the Rams, by virtue of winning the league championship last year, will meet the College All-Stars in the annual Herald-Tribune game at Soldiers Field in Chicago.

Reports from the Cardinal training camp indicate that many rookies will earn regular positions with the team and will be in the lineup against the Rams.

Among them are Harold Lutz of Alabama and Leo Sugar of Purdue, ends; Volney Peters of USC and Burl Toler of San Francisco, tackles; Jerrell Price of Texas Tech and Mike Sikora of Oregon, guards; Darrell Crawford of Georgia Tech and Mal Cook of Georgia, quarterbacks; Johnny Karras and Eli Poppa of Illinois, halfbacks; and Gordon Polofsky of Tennessee, fullback.

In addition the Cardinals will soon have the services of Ollie Matson, the sensational San Francisco All-American who finished third in the 400-meters in the Olympic Games. Matson will join the squad as soon as he returns from Finland and it is virtually certain that he will appear in Portland.

Although the Rams have many outstanding rookies in camp, it's likely that their starting team will be much the same one which won the title last year. In Bob Waterfield and Norm Van Borekkin.
