Efforts To De-Emphasize High School Sports Hit

The effort of a group of coaches and educators to de-emphasize high school sports was soundly rebuffed in a recent survey of Oregon school boards.

The result of the poll, proposed at the combined state coaches and Oregon State Activities Association meeting last spring, was revealed at a meeting of Oregon School superintendents in Salem Friday.

Judging from the poll, the OSAA has heavy support from Oregon schools in the present method of championship playoffs in every sport. The poll was also sponsored by Oregon Superintendent's Association which, according to Roseburg Superintendent M. C. Deller, favored following the decision of the poll's majority.

That majority was a resounding affirmation of the present system of district, regional and state tournaments in all sports.

The major point of discord at the spring meeting, which set the poll in motion, was state football championships. Of the 129 schools reporting decisions of their boards, the vote was two to one (78-39) against discontinuing championship games in the A-1 and A-2 brackets. Both these brackets in the grid sport are reported as self-supporting by the OSAA. It states the "A" football netted approximately \$8,000 last year.

The vote also showed heavy majorities against discontinuing play-

offs in "B" 11-man and six-man football.

The list of three possible changes which might be considered if the state playoffs were discontinued were also turned down soundly.

By varying margins ranging far above two to one, the school boards turned thumbs down on doing away with any other of the annual championships. This includes basketball (another self-sufficient sport which netted \$15,000 last year), track, baseball, cross country, swimming, wrestling, golf and tennis.

In a fashion, the boards gave the OSAA an added vote of confidence by voting in favor of extending the controls of the body.

In other measures listed, the boards voted (1) against moving baseball season into June, (2) against shortening basketball season and (3) against placing the state track meet later in May. The boards also showed a slight preference for playing games and contests on Friday and Saturday instead of Tuesday and Friday. This would affect basketball and baseball.

The results of this poll are definitely not final. They will be studied further by the Board of Control. But the general consensus of concurrence by the Superintendents Friday is a sign pointing to adoption of the majority opinion.

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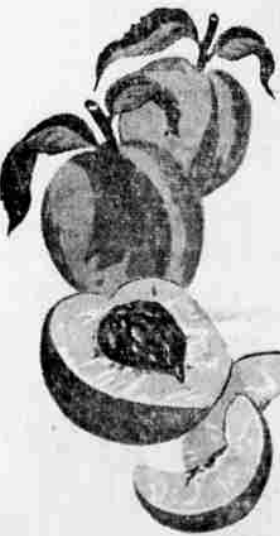
