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Bones Of Indian Thought 15 Centuries Old Found

LITTLE CURRENT, Ont. (P)—Workers from the University of Michigan's anthropology museum have dug up the bones of a Point Peninsula Indian believed to be 1,500 years old. Copper salts which had formed with the body kept the bones in an excellent state of preservation, the diggers reported. The find was made on the north shore of Georgian Bay, a few miles east of here.
