Weyerhaeuser Timber Co.'s Operations At Springfield Toured By Douglas Visitors

"The question most frequently asked by persons of other towns is why can't you build a plant like this in our community?" said J. R. Titcomb, manager of the Springfield operations of Weyerhaeuser Timber Co.
The question is often asked of him in reference to why the Springfield plant can't be duplicated in other areas. But the reason is the company's tree farms could not support additional operations on a sustained basis, he said.

Titcomb was speaking to a large group of employees of Douglas County and other invited persons who were guests of the company at a banquet in the plant's huge cafeteria and were then conducted on a tour of the pulp mill and sawmill operations Wednesday evening.

The tour was arranged by Les Calder, the company's representative in this area. The group was treated royally, with a chicken and ham dinner, topped with strawberry shortcake. The banquet was served at 8 p.m., followed by a two-hour tour of the sawmill and the vast pulp mill operations. The visitors returned to Roseburg in the wee hours of the morning today.

Titcomb, who has managed the

Springfield operations since its infancy in that city has supervised the expansion program to what is now one of the largest and most efficient in the Pacific Northwest.

Douglas Contributes Timber

Approximately 40 per cent of the timber being cut for use in the plant is logged in Douglas County in the Sutherlin area, said Titcomb. The remainder is taken from Little Fall Creek and some from the McKenzie River side in Lane County.

Tree farm operations are conducted in each of the company's 12 timbered areas to produce timber for sustained operations, he pointed out. The size of the plant, such as Springfield's, is such that it cannot be reproduced economically with sustained operation.

The combination of lumber mill, plywood plant (just about ready to start operation), pulp mill and other related operations, make for maximum utilization of forest products, he said. It is possible to economically use lumber of lower grade in the combined operation. Douglas County has a much greater amount of lower grade timber than the areas further north.

Titcomb said daily tours of as many as 50 persons are conducted through the plant at 1:30 p.m. in addition to specially arranged tours such as the large Douglas County group.

The visitors were able to observe and have explained the process of turning wood chips into a tough quality of paper used for lining cardboard boxes. The pulp plant has this one function, as this is the only type of paper that can now be produced from Douglas fir. The company is conducting extensive experiments into further uses of wood waste.

One of the most efficient operations in the Northwest is the sawmill. While sawdust cannot be used in the pulp operation, all other waste material which can be cut into chips can be salvaged. Sawdust is used for fuel to operate the power plant and for manufacture into Pres-to logs.

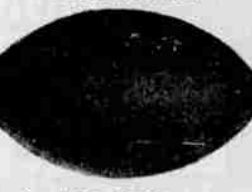

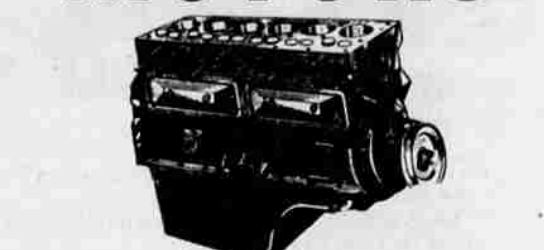
