

Convict Uses Scrap To Fashion TV Set

WETHERSFIELD, Conn. (AP)—A convict named Joe has pierced the walls that do his prison make, and officials are proud of him.

Joe—otherwise unidentified—has built a television set, mainly from salvaged parts and scrap metal from the machine shop at Connecticut state prison. Some parts he bought—some from his frustrating prison pay of \$4.65 a month.

According to Deputy Warden George A. Cummings, Joe's set works perfectly.

But prison officials are more pleased with how Joe has rehabilitated himself from the world.

From a "Kansas tough guy" three years ago, he has become a "model prisoner," Cummings said. Joe will be up for a parole shortly. His plans for the outside? "I'm getting into television," he says. "There's a great future in it."

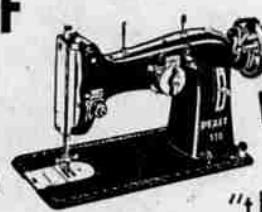
