Rep. Ellsworth Gives Review Of Congress At Rotary Session

Rep. Harris Ellsworth reviewed activities of the 82nd Congress at a luncheon meeting Thursday at the Roseburg Rotary Club.
He opened the discussion by declaring he believed the last Congress "was not too outstanding."
Congressman Ellsworth also suggested that a congress should not have to crowd its agenda by passing thousands of new laws each session.
He said the people's representatives should be handed for consideration only those vital laws necessary to keep up with the trend of the times.

The proposed change over which would place the O & C timber lands, now handled by the bureau of land management under the Department of Interior, to the Department of Agriculture and U. S. Forest Service was also explained.
Rep. Ellsworth pointed out that this change over would be possible only if approved by congress.
During a question and answer period he declared he believed labor in general was really not opposed to the Taft-Hartley Act.
"In the final analysis," he said, "it has really benefited the working man, instead of hurt him."

\$75,000 Damages Asked In Traffic Accident

Highway accident damages of \$75,000 are asked of logging operators in a Circuit Court suit filed by A. M. Rowe.
Defendants are Clifford Bashford and W. J. Hutch.
Rowe alleges he suffered permanent spinal and leg injuries May 5, 1951, when the defendant's truck struck his pickup in the rear and knocked it some 40 feet into a ditch.
Rowe said he had stopped his vehicle behind a school bus which was discharging children.
The State Unemployment Compensation Commission has filed suit against Otis M. Hatcher for \$604.32 allegedly due in employer contributions.
Suit brought against Viggo Lassen by Dubb Shearon for recovery of money allegedly owed on a promissory note, has been settled out of court and dismissed.
