No Rest Till Commies Licked, Rhee Declares

SEOUL, U.R.K. — Thousands in this war-ravaged capital cheered writhing Syngman Rhee Friday as he was inaugurated as his second term as president of South Korea. He promised "no rest" until the Communists are licked.

The 77-year-old president, re-elected Aug. 5 in South Korea's first popular presidential election, proclaimed during the open-air ceremony that Korea's "first charge remains upon the battlefield."

He added that his long-range aim, and that of the U. S. and the U. N., is "the restoration of all Korea as a free, independent, united and democratic nation."

Rhee said the generals assured him U. N. armies would stand firm against the Reds.

Shock Kills Man Trying To Sever Electric Line

BAKER — Collin Edward Cree, 43, died of electric shock trying to cut off power from a mountain substation during a severe lightning storm.

His body was found Thursday, crumpled over a 6,900-volt California Pacific Utilities Co. power line he had attempted to sever with a hunting knife.

By coincidence, he was found on the day that two brothers, Utah and Turman Wilson, won a stay of execution at the Washington State prison. Cree had been questioned in that case when he sought to volunteer information about the killing of Jo Ann Dewey, for which the Wilson brothers were convicted. Nothing came of that though, and it was generally believed he had no special knowledge to offer on the case.

At one time he was a patient in the Washington State Hospital at Steilacoom.

Confirmation that the man killed here had been questioned in the Dewey case was given by Mrs. W. C. Cree, a sister-in-law.

Roger Nelson, company employee, said he believed Cree, a placer miner near Granite, 40 miles west of here, feared lightning might strike a power line and set fire to the wooded area.

He went to the substation and got inside by ripping off a screen and breaking a window. Nelson said broken volt meters, gauges and other equipment indicated Cree had tried to shut off the power.

When he failed, he cut into a main power cable. He was found by E.W. Sausser, a nearby resident who had gone to the substation to investigate the lack of power.

U.S. Reserves Right To Use Atomic Bombs

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. — The United States warned Friday that it reserved the right to use the A-bomb and germ warfare to suppress aggression until weapons are eliminated by an iron-clad system of international safeguards.

The warning was made by U.S. Delegate Benjamin V. Cohen before the U.N. Disarmament Commission where Russia has repeatedly demanded that the U.N. ban force.

Cohen made it clear, however, that the United States does not intend to use such weapons at any time contrary to the terms of the United Nations charter, that it would reserve them for the suppression of aggression forbidden by the charter.

Cohen told Soviet Delegate Jacob A. Malik that the U.S. would never accept a mere paper declaration prohibiting the use of these weapons.

Cohen said: "We are issuing no ultimatums. We are making no threats."

Psycho. Strategy Post Given Adm. Alan Kirk

WASHINGTON — President Truman Thursday appointed Adm. Alan G. Kirk, former ambassador to Moscow, as director of the Psychological Strategy Board.

The board formulates general policy for U.S. information programs abroad and assists the Defense Department in its planning of psychological warfare.

Kirk's appointment is to be effective about Sept. 15. He succeeds Dr. Raymond B. Allen who is leaving to become chancellor of the University of California at Los Angeles.

Kirk, 63, is now chairman of the American Committee for the Liberation of the Peoples of Russia. This is a privately financed committee of citizens.
