EUGENE, Ore. (AP) — Tommy Jacobs of Montebello, Calif., won the Junior Chamber of Commerce junior golf tournament but Kevin Riley of Vancouver, B. C., carried home the first International Jaycee trophy.

Riley fired a 73 on the par-72 Eugene Country Club course Sunday to capture the international trophy match.

Jacobs, who posted a two-under-par 290 for 72 holes to win the Jaycee tournament Saturday, carded a 74 Sunday to finish second behind Riley.

Walcott To Fight Rocky On Sept. 23

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — A crown resting uneasy on his brow, ages Jersey Joe Walcott will put his world heavyweight championship on the line here September 23rd against undefeated Rocky Marciano, a swarming, club-fisted puncher from Brockton, Mass.

This marks only the second time in more than a year that the 38-year-old Cinderella man of boxing from Camden, N. J., ventures to place at stake the title he wrested from Ezzard Charles with a seventh-round knockout in Pittsburgh last year.

Marciano, undefeated in 41 bouts appears confident he'll succeed where Charles failed last June to knock the teetering royal headpiece of boxing from Walcott's time-weathered brow.

And indications are the New England clubber would go into the ring at vast Municipal Stadium an approximate 2 to 1 favorite.

Walcott will place the title in jeopardy for 40 per cent of the gate in a battle which will be televised only to theaters and blacked out even for cinema-viewers in Philadelphia and New England.

Marciano has cut himself in for 20 per cent of the take.

The formal signing of the pact is expected here Tuesday or Wednesday.

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200 Start On Long Grind For U.S. Amateur Honors

SEATTLE (AP) — The United States Golf Association lifted the curtains on its 52nd annual National amateur golf show Monday with a cast of 200 selected performers ready to begin the week long competition for the championship.

Veteran observers of the event think the title fight is wide open, and few expect the defending champion, young Billy Maxwell from Odessa, Tex., to hang on to the crown he won at Bethlehem, Pa., a year ago.

This prediction is hardly of the bold variety, for no champion in the U.S. amateur blue ribbon fixture has scored twice in succession since Lawson Little subdued the field in 1934-35.

This is Seattle's first view of the amateur, and the scene is the Seattle Country Club. Its rolling

acres offers a quality test of golf that measures 6,632 yards and par of 35-36-71.

Ordinarily, club members play to par 73. But the exacting USGA trimmed a stroke off the par five 9th and 16th holes, doubtless to the chagrin of those familiar with the place.

Seventy-two matches were on Monday's schedule, and 56 players drew a day's respite via byes in the blind draw. As had been the custom the past few years, there is no on-the-spot qualifying. The boys simply start hammering away at each other in match play on the first day.
