### Politburo's End Branded Phony

WASHINGTON (AP) — American diplomats said Wednesday that Russia's move to abolish the Politburo is aimed at fooling outsiders as well as Russian citizens into believing the Communist party setup is being democratized.

Experts familiar with Soviet affairs viewed the call for a Communist party congress—the first in 13 years—and the announcement of a new five-year production plan as a combination of propaganda and Communist party necessity.

The word "Politburo," these officials noted, has become a byword for dictatorship even outside Russia.

These diplomats said, too, that the Moscow announcement shows that Georgi Malenkov ranks as a likely successor to Joseph Stalin as the Russian premier.

They pointed to the fact that Malenkov, 50-year-old Politburo member, has been selected to read the main report and said this shows he is firmly entrenched in the Communist hierarchy.

Stalin gave this report personally at the two previous Communist party congress gatherings in 1934 and 1939.

### Portland Carpenters To Vote On Strike Plan

PORTLAND — A strike vote was ordered Friday by the AFL District Council of Carpenters against the Portland Home Builders Association.

Cliff Harris, council president, said the action was taken after the association refused to grant a 15-cent hourly wage increase approved by the Wage Stabilization Board for the light construction building industry.

An association spokesman said his group disputes the interpretation of the WSB order and holds it does not apply generally.

An estimated 800 to 900 carpenters are employed in building homes in the Portland area.
