Oaks Nip Seattle, Pads Bury Stars

They're even-step again, Hollywood and Oakland.
Piper Davis hit a ninth-inning homer that gave Oakland a 2 to 1 decision over Seattle Thursday night, and, it's hard to believe, but San Diego shook off the Hollywood jinx and buried the Stars by a 10 to 6 count.
The pushed Oakland into a first-place tie with Hollywood in their fight for the Pacific Coast League flag.
Los Angeles beat Portland, 4 to 2, and San Francisco downed Sacramento, 5 to 1, in 10 innings, to round out the evening.
Al Widmar of Seattle and Lefty Rog Bowman of Oakland engaged in a hurling duel in Oakland, with Bowman having the edge.
Wal ka man, and only in the seventh inning, did Seattle get more than one hit in an inning.
Seattle's only run was Clarence Maddler's homer in the eighth that tied the score.
Chuck Conors, Los Angeles first baseman, cracked a low pitch into the right-centerfield bleachers at Wrigley Field to give the Angels a decision over Portland.
Eddie Chandler, who walked three men in the first inning, steeled and came up with a two-nitter to score his 14th win.
Conors' homer, coming in the seventh inning, followed Bob Usher's single, as fourth hit of the night. Red Adams, the loser, gave up nine hits.

Sage Hen, Antelope Season Will Be Open On Saturday

Over four months of unbroken hunting are in store for Oregon hunters beginning Saturday with the sage hen season and followed by grouse, mourning dove, banded-tailed pigeon, deer, silver grey squirrel, quail, partridge, elk, and waterfowl seasons.
Sage hen season opens Aug. 23, simultaneously with area 2 and 3 antelope hunts, and ends Sept. 4. The sage hen hunt area includes Harney and Malheur counties and Lake county east of highway 395 and the Warner valley road. Bag limit is 4 sage hen per day and not over 8 during the season. These birds are the largest American grouse and require hard hitting to bring down. Use of shot smaller than number 5 or 6 is not advised.
Outlook for sage hen hunting is reasonably good in Harney and Malheur counties, but there will be no spectacular concentrations such as last year's, an abundance of water being the main reason.
A sharp decline, based on the cyclic nature of sage hen populations, is anticipated after this hunting season. Game agents have already reported large losses in western Lake county. This cyclic behavior is similar to that shown by jack rabbits, and peaks are reached at 10 year intervals.
Public drawings for antelope areas 2 and 3 and the Troy special elk season were held Monday in Portland. Over 1400 applications were received for the 200 permit Troy elk hunt. After screening, 13 successful antelope applicants were cancelled out for false application because they received a paid special season tag last year. One blanked applicant applied twice and had his name drawn to replace the false applications.
Antelope hunters will find it more difficult to bag a trophy this year as there is an unusual carry-over of water on southeastern Oregon ranges and the antelope are widely scattered.
In antelope area 2 between Warner valley and Steens mountains game agents report many pronghorns distributed over Catlow and Jacks valleys. In normal years the antelope from this area are hunted at higher elevations in the ranges south of Hart mountain. Several roads that cross normally dry lake beds, including Jacks lake and Jacobs reservoir are impassible.

Reds' Guns Hit U.S. Ship; 4 Dead

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Navy reported Thursday the destroyer-minesweeper Thompson was hit by Communist shore guns off the East Coast of Korea Wednesday. Four men were killed and ten seriously wounded.
One shell, believed to have been of 105 mm. caliber, struck the vessel's flying bridge, damaging the pilothouse and navigating equipment.
The Thompson was hit earlier in the Korea war, on June 14, 1951, when three of her crew were killed and four wounded by Communist guns.
The Navy said the Thompson carried on the duel with the shore batteries for an unreported time before transferring her dead and wounded to the battleship Iowa.
The action took place off the Korean port of Sonjin.

Shrine All-Star Broadcast Slated

Radio Station KRXL greets the 1952 prep football season with a broadcast Saturday night at 8:15 of the Shrine All-Star game from Portland.
The game is a yearly battle of the top football seniors of Portland High Schools against the best 1952 graduating seniors from the rest of the state.
Douglas County has at least three fingers in that extravagant Shrine-game pie. First, a former Roseburg High School mentor, Mel Ingram, is the head coach for the State All-Star team. Second, the Roseburg Knights of Pythias Drum and Bugle Corps will participate in the magnificent pre-game and halftime pageantry which is as much a drawing card as the game itself. Third, Reedport's sensational Larry Rose has been named first-string fullback on the State squad.

Sports Umpqua Good For Anglers

Although trout fishing is slow in the Steamboat area, it continues good on the lower North Umpqua between Winchester and Eagle Rock, according to this week's Game Commission report.
Steelhead catches are only fair at Steamboat.
Meanwhile, weather conditions and salmon fishing have been excellent at Winchester Bay. The catch is composed mainly of silver salmon. Catfish are being caught at Tenmile Lake and sea-run cutthroat are being taken in coastal streams and freshwater areas.
Elsewhere in southwestern Oregon, Rogue River trout angling is stacking up in the Union Creek area and improving in the Gold Hill-Grants Pass area. Steelhead catches continue to hold up in the Bybee Bridge area, improving in the Grants Pass section. Salmon fishing is good in the lower Rogue River. Offshore salmon fishing at Brookings is fair.

Matman Franco Visits Roseburg

Pete Franco, wrestler, singer and guitar player, has returned to Roseburg after 12 years' absence, and will be interviewed over KRXL tonight at 7:15 on a program entitled "Pete Franco In Person."
The versatile athlete has been wrestling in Australia, as well as in Los Angeles and in the East, and is taking a year off to rest up, following an ear operation caused by wrestling injuries.
Pete states he plans to open a sports club for boys training, free of charge, in Roseburg.

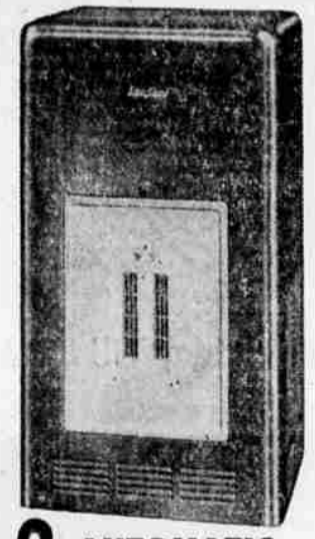
