Rheumatic fever is also known as inflammatory or acute rheumatism. It usually attacks young adults and children, however extremely young children are usually exempt.

Rheumatic fever is a disease of late winter and early spring; it is also more prevalent in cities than in rural areas, and the greatest number of cases appear where persons are subjected to the most crowding.

The greatest damage in rheumatic fever occurs in the heart and arteries. The fever for which the disease is named may play only a minor part in its course.

Rheumatic heart disease is the most serious aspect of rheumatic fever. It may include acute, sub-acute, or chronic involvement of the heart. There are several varieties of rheumatic heart disease; mild where the symptoms are the least severe; medium, and severe inflammation of the heart, where the individual is extremely ill, the heart functions badly, and the person is pale.
