

Two-Way TV Feature At Show

LONDON (AP)—The "Sorry, dear, but I'm working late at the office" dodge may be on the way out—TV-telephone has arrived.

The "I can see you" phone—latest invention of British radio engineers—is a surprise exhibit at London's annual radio show, which opened today.

The caller's image is shown on a television screen at the other end of the circuit, and the caller similarly can see the party on the other end on a television screen in front of him.

A spokesman for the phone makers said it was hoped that TV-telephone would be installed on the New York-London transatlantic line before long.

"It would be invaluable for high-

level inter-governmental talks when people speaking must be certain of each other's identity," he suggested.

But the TV-phone won't be invading the privacy of the home for a while yet—the present model stands as high as a kitchen cabinet and costs around \$2,800.

Japanese Plan To Tap Alaskan Timber Opposed

SEATTLE (AP)—A Japanese proposal to tap the Tongass National Forest in Southeastern Alaska to make up their own timber losses drew protests Tuesday from Pacific Northwest lumber and pulp industries.

"U. S. Department of Commerce officials said spokesmen for the industries were taking the stand that only the U.S. should be permitted to develop the area's timber resources."

The protests stemmed from reports the Japanese government has approached the State Department with a plan to obtain Tongass timber to make up Japan's losses on Sakhalin Island and in Manchuria.

Philip M. Crawford, regional director of the Commerce Department, said a delegation from Japan will visit the U.S. to discuss organization of a 20-million dollar U.S.-Japanese corporation. The Japanese will seek a 10-million dollar loan to help finance the project, he said.

Puget Sound Pulp & Paper Co., and Rayonier, Inc., expressed concern over the plan. Puget Sound plans to use Tongass timber in a 40-million dollar pulp development near Ketchikan, and Rayonier has applied for the timber for use in its U.S. plants.

Use Of Wood Indispensable In Superliner

Building of the mammoth new superliner, SS United States, would not have been possible without the use of wood. So says the United States Lines, owner of the pride of the U. S. maritime fleet.

More wood was used in the construction of the SS United States—an all-metal ship—than is normally used in the construction of large all-wood vessels. In fact, the SS U.S. is the world's greatest "wooden" ship, for its birth required enough lumber, poles and blocks to stretch out 200 miles if placed end to end. The nearly 3 million board feet of lumber and wood that went into its construction would build at least 12 ships the size of the "Constitution," or three ocean-going ships 300 feet in length.

United States Lines figures on the tremendous amount of wood used to build the superliner reveal enough pine boards—850,000 feet—to build a 2,000-ton wooden ship 300 feet long. The shipyard's pattern makers needed an additional 187,000 board feet of wood; another 150,000 board feet went into protective coverings, packing and shipping cases. For purposes such as braces, ladders, ribband and stage boards, 2,082,000 board feet of Douglas fir and

Southern pine were used. Shipbuilders require a large supply of wood for scaffolding. Just the supports for the scaffolding erected during the construction of this modern passenger ship took six and one half miles of pine poles—some of which were as much as 95 feet high. Staging utilized 240,000 board feet of Douglas fir poles.

Enough oak blocks went into cribbing and shoring the liner to build more than 14 two-story, six room houses. Oak timbers used as keel track and cribbing amounted to 222,000 board feet. There were 115,700 board feet of Southern pine poles used in shoring; and additional 66,900 board feet of Southern pine lumber for blocking and shoring.

Shipbuilding Contract Policy To Be Changed

WASHINGTON (AP)—In order to maintain active shipbuilding yards in all sections of the country, the government Wednesday abandoned its policy of channelling most construction contracts to yards in areas where there is unemployment.

Acting Mobilization Chief John R. Steelman ordered the Defense Department to take into consideration idle shipyard facilities as well as surplus labor when it places contracts.

Stelman said this will assure a greater number of yards being kept ready for operation with skilled labor available in event of total mobilization. He said it is in the interest of national security that shipbuilding and repair be dispersed as widely as practicable.

\$5 BUYS SCHOOL

CENTRALIA, Ill. (AP)—Five dollars at an auction bought a two-story brick school at Smithton, Ill., though it was built in 1888 for \$4,000. Catch was that the buyer, Belmont Valentine, had only 45 days to remove the school.

Gain In U.S. War Vets Since Korea Reported

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Veterans Administration reported today that the number of veterans with service since the start of the Korean War reached 1,021,000 on July 31. That was a gain of 100,000 during July, compared with 51,000 in June.

As of July 31 the V. A. estimated there were 19,376,000 living veterans of all wars and peacetime service, compared with 19,288,000 on June 30 and 18,898,000 on July 31, 1951.

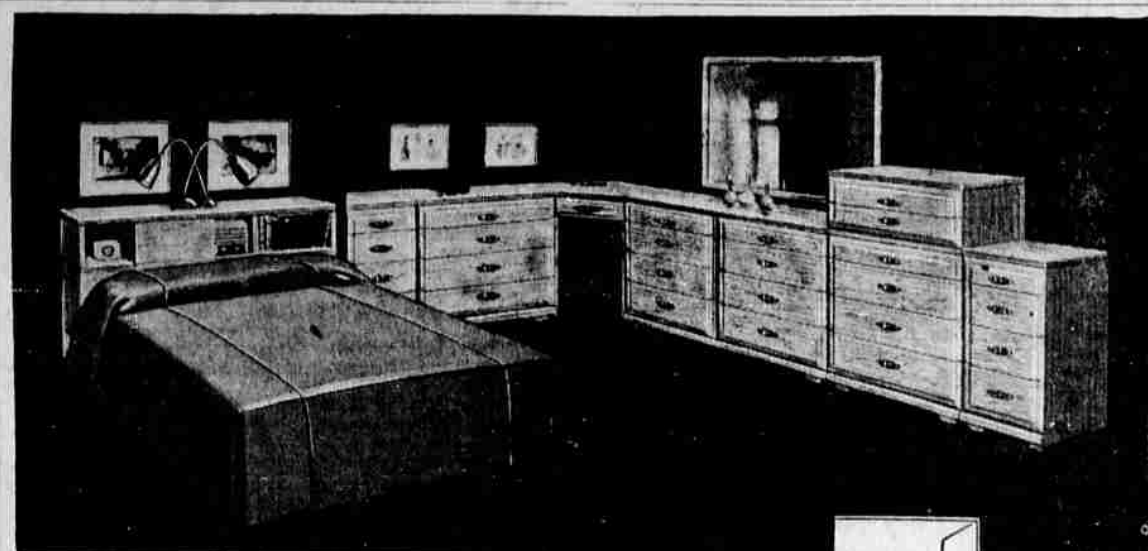
