WASHINGTON — The Republican National Committee set up Tuesday a farm council organizing committee which it said will serve as "a leader of tremendous farm forces for the election of Eisenhower and Nixon."

Arthur E. Summerfield, the party's national chairman, said the new committee will operate in all farming areas of the country. It will be headed by Harold L. McKinley, livestock, grain and vegetable farmer from Saint Ansgar, Iowa.

McKinley was chairman of the GOP Platform Committee's agricultural group at the Chicago convention.
