EUGENE (AP) — Ray Overholser, former project engineer at Detroit Dam, has been named as the new resident engineer for the Lookout Point Dam project on the middle fork of the Willamette River south-east of here.

Overholser replaces Tom Waring, who acted as resident engineer since C. C. Davis was transferred from the job earlier this year.

SP Line Reports Plans For 2,004 New Freight Cars

Construction of 2004 new freight cars of various types has just been authorized by Southern Pacific as an initial step in the railroad's 1953 freight car acquisition program.

In making this announcement, President D. J. Russell said that construction of the new cars will progress as rapidly as possible to continue an ample supply of equipment to meet the needs of national defense and expanding industrial traffic in the railroad's territory.

The cars may be built in the company's own shops at Sacramento and Alhambra, La., he said.

Of the new cars, 1000 will be 70-ton flat cars, 53 1/2 foot long, a type desired by lumber shippers and receivers; 450 all-steel, hopper bottom gondolas; 350 light bottom gondolas; four heavy duty special type flat cars of 200 ton and 125 ton capacity; 100 special type 50-ton pulpwood flat cars with end-racks; and 100 special type 70-ton gondolas for sulphur service.

The latter 200 cars are for assignment to the company's lines in Texas and Louisiana.

President Russell pointed out that since the end of the war Southern Pacific has placed 31,156 freight cars in service and 4,744 additional freight cars remain to be delivered on orders placed last year.

In addition, the Pacific Fruit Express Co., in which SP is half owner, has added 10,075 new refrigerator cars to its fleet of equipment since the end of the war, and 25 extra large 70-ton refrigerator cars are on order for delivery early next year.

American Legion Wants Korea Military Control

NEW YORK (AP) — The American Legion has asked the administration to abandon "political control" of the Korean war and give the military complete authority for its conduct.

The legion adopted the resolution at the close of its 34th annual convention in Madison Square Garden Thursday night after hearing the three civilian heads of the armed forces — Secretary Thomas C. Finletter of The Air Force, Secretary Dan Kimball of the Navy, and Secretary Frank Pace, Jr., of the Army.

All three gave optimistic appraisals of this country's rearmament effort.

The resolution on conduct of the Korean war was adopted unanimously.

Still 300 Stateless Refugees In Shanghai

HONG KONG (AP) — There are still 300 stateless refugees in the International Refugee Organization's camps in Shanghai, arrivals from that city say.

The refugees get \$5 a month from IRO, but they cannot live adequately on that amount and their condition is becoming desperate. The arrivals say the Communist authorities in Shanghai tolerate the camps and the IRO representatives.

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
