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Stevenson On Short End Of Betting In Britain

LONDON (AP) — One of Britain's leading handbooks made Democrat Adlai Stevenson a 1 to 2 favorite Thursday to win the U.S. presidential race from Republican Dwight D. Eisenhower.

The short price on the Illinois governor was quoted by Douglas Stuart Ltd.

"The bettors make the odds, and the bulk of the bets we've taken have been on the Democrat," said Stuart's odds-maker. "Most of the money has come in from Americans residing here, but we also have handled quite a few from British bettors."

Americans in England include hundreds employed by U.S. government agencies.

Meanwhile, Alistair Cooke, U.S. correspondent of the liberal, independent Manchester Guardian, predicted Stevenson will win 300 electoral votes in November—34 more than the necessary majority of 268.

India Returns China's Famine Relief Donation

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — India Thursday returned Red China's famine relief donation of 400,000 rupees (\$84,000) because it had political strings attached.

The government acted to head off a similar gift from the Soviet Union.

A Foreign Office spokesman said the Chinese presented the gift 10 weeks ago to the Indian Red Cross society with the kicker that the funds should be distributed through the Communist-sponsored "Famine Relief Committee" in Andhra region, Madras state, a Communist stronghold.

The government thus rebuffed what was tantamount to Peiping's underwriting of a political movement seeking to overthrow Prime Minister Nehru's regime.
