The victim was Peter H. Matson, 55, of Oakridge, a loader for Pope and Talbot.



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Slavery In Soviet Bared In Report

WASHINGTON (U) — The State Department spread on the record Friday a mass of evidence that the Soviet Union and its satellites have millions of captives in slave labor camps.

With President Truman's endorsement, the department made public a 68-page report rounding up official documents, testimony on refugees and other evidence in support of this conclusion:

"The number of slave laborers in the Soviet Union and its satellites runs into the millions and represents the most extreme violation of human rights on the face of the earth today."

It was a detailed summary of evidence prepared for a special fact-finding committee of the United Nations and the International Labor Organization. The committee held hearings at New York in June, and is due to resume sessions next month at Geneva, Switzerland.

Morse's Refusal To Aid Ike Draws CIO Praise

PORTLAND (U) — Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore.) was commended Thursday by the Oregon CIO on his decision not to campaign for Gen. Eisenhower, Republican candidate for President.

A telegram signed by George Brown, state CIO secretary, said: "We wish you to know that you have our full support in the position you have taken."

Not Bolting GOP, Morse Explains

NEW YORK (U) — Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore.) says his refusal to campaign for Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower for President does not mean he is bolting the GOP.

Morse, in his speech Thursday before the AFL convention, was critical of Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio—whom he termed a "substitute quarterback" leading the GOP "toward a defeat."

Later, at a news conference, Morse said he was "taking a stroll as of now" but added:

"I'm supporting him (Eisenhower) as of now, to the extent that I have expressed it in the (convention) speech."

One bolts a party when he campaigns for the opposition, Morse said, and to "take a walk" simply means one does not campaign for his own party candidates.

In his AFL speech, Morse said he would stand behind Eisenhower for amendment rather than repeal of the Taft-Hartley Act.

Prison Inmates Make Business Of Song Writing

SALEM, Ore. (U) — Two Oregon State prison inmates made such a hit with a couple of songs they wrote for a prison show last winter that now they're in business, from the inside, too.

They've picked up some financial backing, the approval of Warden Virgil O'Malley and have turned out a half dozen new songs.

When last winter's show — written, staged and acted by convicts — turned up a profit of \$7,400 for the Heart Fund, the two men who got the biggest critical praise were Seth Schwartz, 33, and Bob Nealey, 46.

Their songs "It's No Dream," and "Too Many Clouds in the Sky," had brought down the house.

The warden approved when they said they wanted to go into the music business and got backing from outsiders they won't name.

It's visitors' day that brings their inspiration, they say.

"A little old lady with a tear in her eye as she was talking to her son," said Schwartz, led to a song called "A Lady From a Very Small Town."

They are turning out records, on tape with the prison orchestra. The tape is sent out to a record manufacturer. They've arranged, too, for sheet music publication.

Schwartz, serving his third term for check forgery, has completed four years of his current 20-year term. Nealey is on his eighth term, this one for life on an assault-with-intent-to-kill conviction.
