Speaking at a ceremony at the University of Portland where he received an honorary degree, the archbishop said that the progress of the Communist idea throughout the world was evidence of the failure of Christians to live according to their convictions. The archbishop will speak at the convention of the National Council of Catholic Women which opens Saturday at Seattle.

SAN FRANCISCO — Surgeons Saturday were trying to save the life of a traffic officer who shot it out with an ex-convict on downtown Market Street.

Although wounded twice in the abdomen and once in an arm, officer Robert Walters, 39, took careful aim as a holdup man fled along San Francisco's "slot" during the height of the home-going rush Friday.

While scores of persons took shelter in nearby doorways, the pain-wracked Walters hit a running man, once in the spine in both thighs and the left arm.
