

Henry Baracunas Passes Suddenly

Henry Baracunas, 36, resident of 1900 Beacon Way, died very suddenly last night after suffering a heart attack. He was born Feb. 9, 1916, in Chehalis, Wash., and came to Roseburg five years ago to make his home.

He was a veteran of World War II and was a mechanic for the Rose Motor Co. at the time of his death. He was a member of the Catholic Church and of the Hoisting Engineers Union No. 701, of Portland.

Surviving are his widow, Anita, Roseburg; two brothers, Stanley and Frank Baracunas, both of Olympia, Wash.; seven sisters: Mrs. Helen E. Ames and Mrs. Hedwig J. Turner, both of Olympia; Mrs. Frances Dodge, Portland; Mrs. Josephine Piest of Alaska; Mrs. Dorothy Ward, Mrs. Adelaide K. Flury and Mrs. Mary Foster, all of Roseburg.

Funeral services will be held in The Chapel of The Roses, Roseburg Funeral Home, Monday, Sept. 29, at 10 a.m. with Father Edmund Hyland of the St. Joseph Catholic Church officiating. Interment will follow in Coles Valley Cemetery.

Truman Scores Isolationists

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Truman said Friday that "old isolationists" are making a growing attempt to undermine the United Nations and are playing politics with national security.

"We must disregard this hysterical and conflicting advice," the President asserted in a talk to the National Citizens Committee for United Nations Day.

He did not name the "old isolationists" he assailed. "We must withstand the efforts of those who would play politics with security and the welfare of our nation and the freedom of our allies," Truman said.

"In spite of the great achievements of the United Nations, in spite of the hope that it holds for

all mankind, we face within our borders a growing attempt to undermine it.

"The old isolationists have grown bolder."
