Ralph Kiner Put On Ball Market

NEW YORK (AP) — Ralph Kiner, seven-time home run king of the National League, has been placed on the market to the highest bidder, the Associated Press learned today.

It also was learned that the Chicago Cubs and Boston Braves had shown interest in the Pittsburgh Pirate slugger but were balking at the "skyscraping" figure put on him by Pittsburgh General Manager Branch Rickey.

Kiner, who will be 30 years old Oct. 27, is ranked as one of the greatest sluggers baseball has ever known. The 6-foot-2 native of New Mexico has led or tied for the National League lead in home runs ever since he came up to the majors in 1946.

Hampered by illness during the first half of the season, Kiner got off to a slow start this year but closed fast to tie Hank Sauer of the Cubs for the homer leadership at 37. It was his lowest home run total in six years, but it gave him a lifetime figure of 294 round trippers in seven seasons. He batted only .244.

One drawback to the sale of Kiner is his huge salary. The good-natured outfielder was paid \$75,000 last year, second in the majors only to Stan Musial's \$85,000 salary. It was a one-year pact.

CV's Mel Packard Out For Season With Injury

Aerial Warfare Probable In Friday Game At Finlay

Friday's non-league football tilt on Finlay Field between Roseburg and Coquille shapes up as a passing circus.

When the Indians and Red Devils trot on the field at 4 p.m. Friday night, the slingshot arms of Bud Backen and Allan Dungey will be cocked for a game-long aerial warfare.

Backen impressed both the fans and Coach Bill Reder with his passing ability in chalking up 165 yards against Myrtle Point last weekend. Dungey was no less impressive in aiding his Devils to 144 air yards against North Bend in the first game of the season.

With the effectiveness of the air attack increasing by the week, Coach Reder is again stressing the pass attack in nightly practices this week. At the same time, he is making special efforts to plug up the defensive holes which have allowed plenty of aerial work against the Indians.

After watching Coquille's Dungey in action at Myrtle Creek last Saturday, Reder had plenty of laurels to toss the way of the 194-pound quarterback. But he pointed out that the Red Devils have plenty of power in their halfbacks, Ed Atkinson and John DeMain. Both were power houses at Myrtle Creek.

Rams' Mentor, Stydhar, Goes

LOS ANGELES (AP) — President Dan Reeves of the Los Angeles Rams announced Tuesday Head Coach Joe Stydhar has resigned and his backfield assistant, Hampton Pool, has been named his successor.

Reeves said Stydhar, who has suffered four straight losses this year, will receive full pay under his contract for the rest of this year plus \$7,500 for next year. Stydhar reportedly receives \$15,000 yearly.

Jumbo Joe, who has given the Rams two National Football League titles and the world championship over Cleveland last year, was not immediately available for comment.

He said Monday, however, that there has been discussion between himself and Pool. Stydhar's position was that changes would have to be made if the Rams were to continue their winning ways this year.

Pool told reporters he is going to bear down on the Rams to get them to give their level best all the time. He said he is going to be tough where Stydhar was easy going.

"Show me the 10 top winning teams in the United States and I'll show you the 10 most hated coaches," Pool told newsmen at the Rams' first practice session under his guidance.

The Rams face the Detroit Lions here Friday night and they'll be without the services of their two star ends, Elroy Hirsch and Tommy Pears, who are nursing injuries.

Los Angeles has lost four straight games, including its first league contest last Sunday to the Cleveland Browns, 37-7.

Allie Reynolds, New York — I feel okay. I know that the series starts today. I believe we're up for the game. I know I am, and that's about it.

Out fielders Carl Furillo of the Brooks and Gene Woodling of the Yankees, each of whom is nursing a slight injury, are not worrying. Furillo's left hand is taped. "The only time I feel my pain is when I swing at one and miss it," said Carl. "But the bandage helps."

Woodling's groin injury seems to have healed and he said he felt "fine" when he lifted his bat.
