Mail Order Husband Pays \$700 To Get Out Of Jail

CINCINNATI (AP)—La Cameron Trent, 61-year-old Lovland, O., businessman who wooed and won a British wife by correspondence, is out of jail.

Trent was committed to jail Sept. 23 for failure to pay a court-ordered \$30 a week support to his wife, Mrs. Olga Julia Trent, a native of Hull, England. Both have divorce proceedings pending.
