Anglican Cleric With Grievance Denied Passport

LONDON (AP) — An Anglican clergyman who tried at past United Nations Assemblies to get South Africa censured for its treatment of Negroes says U. S. immigration regulations are keeping him from the U. N. Assembly opening in New York Oct. 14.

The Rev. Michael Scott told a news conference he had applied for a visa at the U. S. Embassy here July 30 but refused to swear he was never a member of a totalitarian organization or to say in what organizations he held membership.

The 45-year-old white churchman declared:

"If this screening principle is to be applied to individuals, it seems a serious limitation of the freedom of the United Nations and the access of people to it. I think the oath is wrong. ... I am not a Communist."

Scott said he wanted to attend the U. N. session as a representative of the International League for the Rights of Man.

In Washington, the State Department said it had no comment.

Elevator Operators' Strike Hits Chicago

CHICAGO — Federal mediators moved today in an attempt to end an elevator operators' strike which has crippled business operations in more than 100 office buildings in Chicago's downtown district.

The strike, stemming from a dispute over wages and hours, affected an estimated half million daily users of the 120 struck buildings. Thousands of office workers in the loop skyscrapers were made idle as many firms closed when the strike started yesterday.

Working schedules in the city's largest buildings were snarled. Hotels, department stores, hospitals and public buildings were not affected by the walkout of 1,350 AFL operators and starters.

The Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service summoned union and management representatives to a meeting to renew negotiations.

The union struck in support of demands for a cut in the work week from 48 to 40 hours and an unspecified increase in pay. Under the old contract which ended yesterday, the weekly wage rate was \$76.96 for operators and \$83.48 for starters.

Estate Problems To Be Discussed At Oct. 7 Forum

Typical estate problems which face the majority of American families will be discussed at a special estate and trust forum to be presented by the United States National Bank at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 7, in the Roseburg Woman's clubhouse, according to Harold E. Schmeer, manager of the Roseburg Branch.

A three-man team from the United States National's head office in Portland will conduct the program, which is to be a non-technical presentation of facts and methods of estate management applicable to the average family. Both estate planning and tax economies will be included.

As pointed out by E. C. Sammons, president of the bank, every estate owner today is tax conscious and in search of ways and means of minimizing estate taxes. Purpose of these forums is to present some of the answers to such problems.

Services To Be Outlined

R. M. Alton, vice president and head of the United States National Bank's trust department, will explain the organization of the bank's trust department and outline the services available. He will touch upon the responsibility of public corporations in handling trusts and estates and will present supervisory procedures and safeguards.

Trust Officer L. B. Staver's talk will emphasize the need for a properly drawn will and point out pitfalls to be avoided. He will also discuss estate administration and state federal estate taxes.

In discussing modern estate plans, D. W. MacKay, trust counselor, will analyze a sample estate and set up a typical estate plan. He will show the advantages of modern trusts and explain living trusts. MacKay served as an officer of the bank's trust department 22 years, retiring July 1 of this year. He has been recalled from retirement to serve as counselor on trusts and estates.

Opportunities will be provided for questions from the audience according to Schmeer, who will act as presiding officer. A social hour will complete the program.

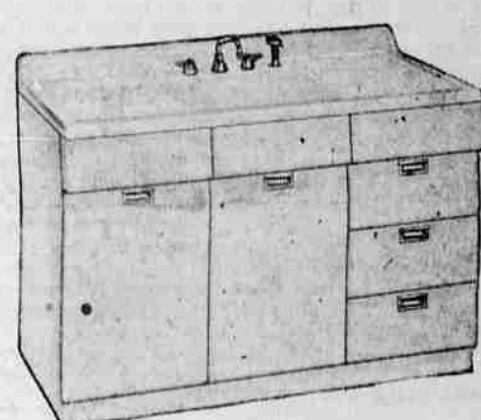

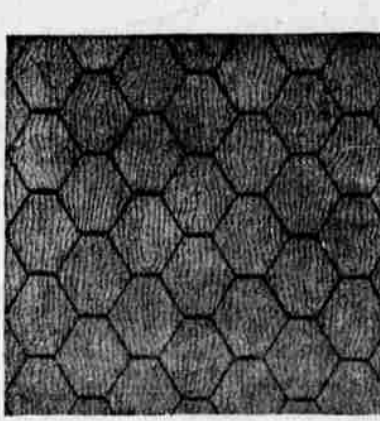

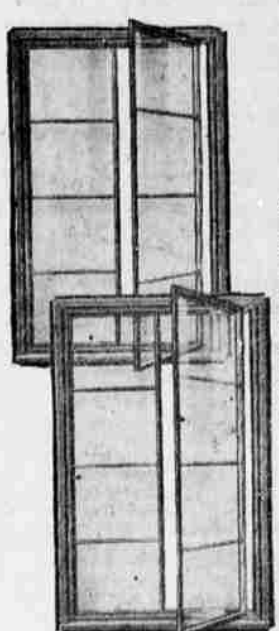
