U.S. Purchases Turkeys For School Lunches

WASHINGTON (AP)—Purchase of 3,195,000 pounds of frozen ready-to-cook turkeys of the 1952 crop as part of the surplus removal program was announced Friday by the Agriculture Department.

The program was placed in operation Aug. 26 to provide an outlet for a temporary surplus of turkeys which the department said resulted in unfavorable producer prices.

Turkeys bought now will be delivered during October and November and used in non-profit school lunch programs, the department said.

The purchases announced Friday included California, 480,000; Nebraska, 465,000; Ohio, 480,000; Oregon, 300,000; Utah, 60,000; Texas, 540,000; and Virginia 120,000.

She listed the following activities for which Gray Ladies are badly needed: speechwriters, choral groups, drama club, library and bookcart services, someone who can play the piano fairly well for a musical quiz program, which has always been popular, and many more activities making possible a wide variety of programs from which to choose.

McCarthy Gets Okay From Ike In Wisconsin

Aboard The Eisenhower Special (AP)—A home town crowd roared its approval Friday as Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy appeared on the platform with Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower and introduced to them the GOP presidential nominee.

The appearance at Appleton came just after Eisenhower threw his support behind McCarthy for reelection despite the differences he said exist between them.

The GOP presidential nominee publicly gave his backing to the controversial Wisconsin senator—seeking a second term in the Senate—by saying it was necessary to elect a Republican team and Congress.

"We've got to have a strong party in January," Eisenhower told a cheering crowd at Green Bay on the first stop in his drive through McCarthy's home state.

"I ask the people of Wisconsin to elect the entire slate of those we have nominated on our party ticket."

Eisenhower pledged, if elected, to keep subversives out of the executive department.

He said a Republican administration would welcome congressional investigation—"but will not depend" upon them to do the job of rooting out disloyalty.

Italy Abolishes Ban On Church Of Christ

ROME (AP)—The Italian government Friday lifted its ban against operations of the American-sponsored Church of Christ in Italy. The U. S. embassy, announcing the decision, said it followed discussions between the embassy and the Italian government.

The denomination's 22 churches and one orphanage will be permitted to operate as usual during the period while their application for permanent permission is being acted upon by the government.
