Gavilan Outboxes Graham In Bout

HAVANA, Cuba (AP) — Cuba's Kid Gavilan outboxed and outsmarted New York's Billy Graham in their second battle for the welterweight boxing championship of the world.

Gavilan Sunday night took at least 11 of the 15 rounds, and left no doubt about the decision this time. There are still many who say Graham should have had the decision in their New York title bout Aug. 19, 1951.

Gavilan this time was the master of the situation nearly all the way. But the Cuban was so cautious not to let his welterweight crown get away from him that it was not much of a spectacle, as a fight.

Throughout the fight, Gavilan played it smart. He forced Graham to lead, and was swift to push a left fist into the openings. In the 15th round, Graham fought savagely. He realized he was far behind on point score, hoped for a lucky knockout punch. But he had neither the timing nor the power.

And he was slow most of the fight. Graham's face was cut considerably by Gavilan's short jabs. The New Yorker's right eye was almost swollen shut. There was a cut under that eye, another under the left one, and on his nose.

Chinook Run Hits New High In 1952

Spring chinooks are making a comeback in the North Umpqua River, according to the tally at the Game Commission fish counting station at Winchester Dam.

By July 15 this year 4,409 adult chinooks had passed through, the highest number since counting was started in 1946.

This season's parent run of 1947 totalled 2,294.

Salmon counts for previous years are as follows: 1,974, in 1946; 2,994 in 1947; 2,245 in 1948; 2,109 in 1949; 2,044 in 1950, and 2,940 in 1951.

Total figures for the 1952 run are not available as yet, but the record has far surpassed previous years.

Summer steelhead also moved through the counting station in larger numbers than have been experienced in previous seasons.

As of July 15, 2,650 fish had been counted.

Keyed-Up Bench Warmer Tackles TD Sprinter

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) — You've heard of such things, but college fans here saw it happen — a keyed up football player rushing straight from the bench to tackle a rival runner sprinting for a touchdown.

That's what guard Ed McDaniels did while sitting out part of the Mississippi Southern-University of Tampa game Saturday night.

Mississippi Southern had kicked off to Tampa. Halfback Bob Boucher got the ball, lateraled to Vince Chicko on the two.

Chicko struck out for the sideline and did some classy running, getting away from the entire Mississippi team.

Suddenly Chicko flew into the air and hit the dirt. McDaniels was so excited he had leaped from the bench, run to the sideline and thrown the tackle.

Field Judge Bob Greutzmacher rushed up with a rulebook and officials decided Chicko was entitled to a touchdown because in their opinion he could have made it except for that 15th-man tackle.

The Rochester Red Wings, trailing the Kansas City Blues at one point by three games to one, swept the last three games to beat the American Association play-off champs. Rochester took the final here Saturday night, 6-4.

'Outstanding Star' Title Race Between Mize, Snider

NEW YORK (AP) — Outstanding star of the 1952 World Series?

It's a close contest between the Yankees' "Old Pappy," Johnny Mize, and the Dodgers' Duke Snider, who wore the horns of the series in 1949. Final games should tell.

Mize, 39-year-old National league refugee, has poled three prodigious home runs in successive games to tie a record and is hitting a lousy .444 in nine plate appearances.

Snider has hit two home runs, personally won two ball games for Brooklyn and been a Dodger spark-plug all the way. His homer won the first game, 4-2, and his double in the 11th won the Sunday game, 6-5, after his homer had given Brooklyn a lead, later lost.

This could easily be the home-run-bittingest World Series of them all. Ten out-of-the-park blows already have been struck. The record for a six-game series is 11, hit by the Yankees and Giants in 1936. For a seven-game set, it's 12, set by Pittsburgh and Washington in 1925.

Mize himself might have erased a number of Babe Ruth's homer marks if he'd been able to play the full route. He has already hit three in three games, one of these games as a pinch-hitter.

The series record for individual home runs in a six-game set is three, set by Ruth in 1923 against the Giants and already tied by Mize. For seven games, the mark is four, set by Ruth in 1926 against the Cardinals.

Numerologists must have had a field day at the expense of Carl Erskine, who won Sunday's game for Brooklyn on his fifth wedding anniversary on Oct. 5 in the fifth game of the series, giving up five hits. Carrying it further, Carl, whose two boys are aged 2 and 3 for a total of five years, gave up five runs to the Yankees in the fifth inning before finally prevailing, 6-3.

TEAM AVERAGE IS 19.7
