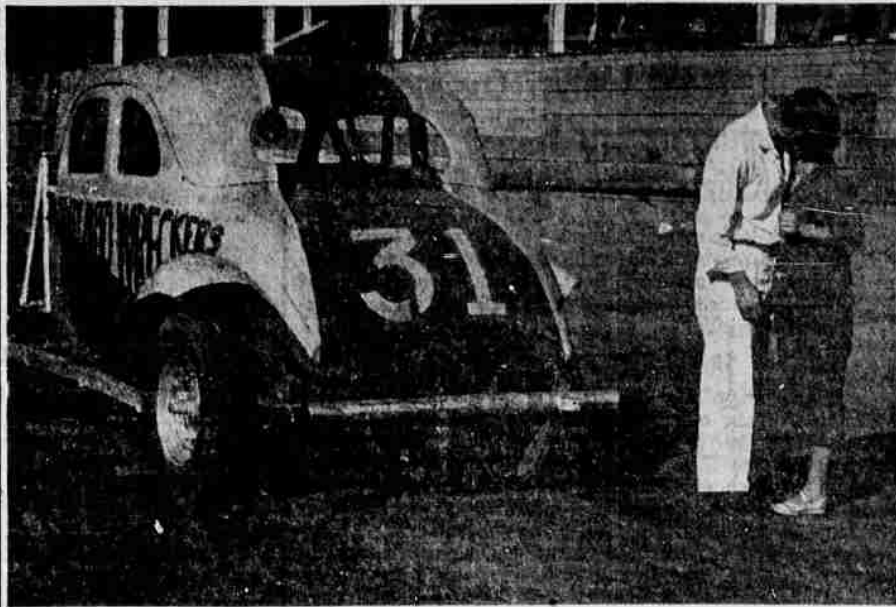

Wade Race Track 'Angel'

D. W. Wade of Roseburg can be lauded as one of the major moving forces behind the establishment of hardtop racing in Douglas County.

According to information received today from his son, Joseph Wade, the elder Wade is the "angel" behind the quarter-mile track to be christened this Sunday at 2 p.m.

The newly-established oval is located south of Roseburg about a quarter mile off Highway 99. It is situated on the first road to the

left past the Speedway Cafe going from Roseburg.

Spokesman Joe Wade pointed out that the track is being opened for racing at this late stage of the season only to break it in. He stated that the only facilities available beside the track are a parking lot and a guard rail around the oval to protect spectators. No grandstand or rest room facilities will be installed until next spring when a full season of racing is expected to be launched.

Because of the still raw state of the track, Wade said, no admission will be charged to the inauguration of the track in spite of the full-scale activities planned. He did note, however, that donations toward defraying expenses will be taken.

Cars from both Grants Pass and the local fleet from the Pacific Racing Association will participate in the planned three-hour program. The Grants Pass Association is entering into the spirit of the occasion by furnishing timing devices, officials and loudspeaker facilities.

Earlier in the week, Pacific Racing Association President Frank Flochini announced that a full agenda of racing is slated for the inauguration to show local fans that the PRA is in earnest in its effort to establish racing in the area. This means time trials, heat races, a trophy dash, semi-final and main event.

Meanwhile, Joe Wade, who will

act as track manager, was uncertain of the exact future status of the track. It will either be held under private ownership by D. W. Wade or leased to the PRA. He stated that the latter choice is most likely.

Three UO Gridders Back 'In Shape' For Bears

EUGENE, Ore. (AP)—Three Oregon players who missed last week's game with Idaho will be in shape for Saturday's Pacific Coast Conference football clash with California at Portland.

Coach Len Casanova said Tuesday tackle Len Berrie, end Ron Lyman and halfback Ted Anderson are back in the lineup and will face the undefeated Bears.

Casanova said the Ducks are pinning their hopes for a victory Saturday on their passing game, the second best in the PCC after three weeks of play.

Jr. High Gridders Lick Sutherlin, 12-6

The Roseburg Junior High School eighth graders won their season's opener against Sutherlin yesterday afternoon on Finlay Field by a score of 12-6.

Showing the usual first-game pessimism, Coach Hod Turner expressed a hope for improvement before the next contest against Cottage Grove here Saturday morning at 10.

He stated that the margin of difference in yesterday's score was "heads ball" on the part of his charges.

The young Papooses depended on power alone in the first quarter to take a 6-0 lead. It was Tippy

Swales who bulled through for the initial score. Sutherlin's eighth graders evened the count in the third quarter on an 80-yard run from scrimmage.

That's when the "heads up" factor showed up. Going into the fourth quarter with the score tied, the Roseburg gridders powered

deep into Sutherlin territory again, but lost the ball on a fumble. Two plays later, Bill Oerding intercepted a Sutherlin pass and scampered 25 yards to a touchdown.

Hod Turner's youngsters definitely had a hard time checking the more polished Sutherlin team.

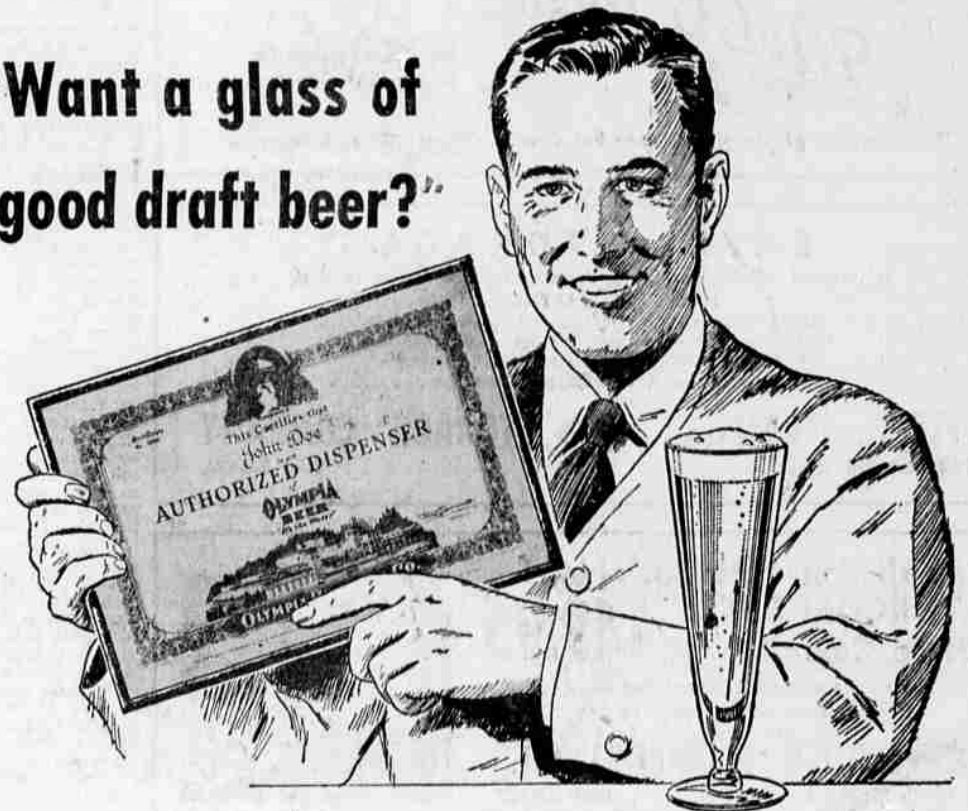
