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Aviation Career Covers 25 Years

Ira Byrd, under-sheriff for Douglas county, is pictured as he leans on the prop of a Stinson Voyager at the flying club field at the old airport, after returning from one of his many official flights. These include, among others, the transporting of prisoners; of certain county officials in line of their various duties; reconnaissance flying during disaster periods, such as the big flood we had two years ago; spotting of forest fires which may endanger county owned timber and, important in his sphere of criminal detection, the spotting from the air, of suspects. Delinquency Is Problem Effect, States Stults

"Juvenile delinquency as such is the effect and not the cause of what ever is at the root of the problem."

These were the words of Robert Stults, who spoke as a citizen and not the district attorney, in an address to the American Legion, Umpqua Post 16, Tuesday evening.

Tracing the cause to the home, Stults suggested education of the parents as a possible method of reducing the JD rates.

Mother, 19, Convicted In Slaying Of Husband

MUNICH, Germany, (AP)—Mrs. Martha Joan Wage, 19-year-old Red Wing, Minn., mother of two children, was found guilty today of intentional manslaughter in the fatal shooting of her husband, U. S. Air Force Sgt. Dan P. Wage of Baldwin, Wis.

The court sentenced her to a prison term of two years and six months. She showed no sign of emotion as sentence was announced.

Her emotion-packed testimony wrung tears of sympathy from many of the women in the courtroom during the trial, particularly

when she told of infidelities, rough treatment and taunts from her husband.
